The International Telecommunication Union (ITU) is pleased to invite your organization to participate in the Planning Meeting to **launch the HIPSSA Project**, aimed at supporting harmonization of ICT policies, legislation and regulatory procedures in Sub Sahara Africa. **The meeting will take place in Addis Ababa on 11-12 December 2008.**

- Dispute settlement

- Cyber-security
- Market data collection and information sharing

This critical meeting will give stakeholders an opportunity to better understand the scale and scope of the project, finalise the areas covered by this project and adopt a work plan in respect of the activities to be undertaken. We are hoping to have your presence at this important meeting. Your contribution will be vital to clarifying and making more precise the scope, focus and modalities of implementation of the project.

I am confident, given the dynamic nature of the ICT sector, that the activities to be undertaken in Sub-Sahara Africa through this project will bring significant benefits and we would encourage you to make a presentation on past, ongoing or future harmonization efforts in your region, which would greatly assist the participants in identifying the key issues that should be primarily covered by this project.
