Opening Session

- In her opening remark, Ms. Doreen Bogdan Martin introduced the Network of Women that aims to build a support structure for talented female delegates in the lead up to WTDC-21, and beyond.
- Having more leadership roles in the structures that make up ITU-D, such as study groups chairs, committee chairs, vice chairs are necessary for a more inclusive WTDC-21.
- Women play a crucial role in making progress towards leveraging digital for development by bringing innovative solutions to the challenges they face.
- The number of female delegates in the Arab region has risen significantly from 18.8%,21%, and 50% in 2013, 2017 and 2021 respectively.
- Dr. Deemah al Yahia, stressed on the importance of this initiative and the need for women to be job creators not job seekers in the digital era.
- There is a need to nurturing innovative role models that made change in digital economy.
- It's important to amplifying effect to make changes in culture, identify the gaps in market, and bridge these gaps through innovative solutions either in public or private sector.
- Internet connectivity is important to empower women to find jobs, initiate start-up, access quality education, and expose to other cultures.

Session: Experiences on nurturing the participation of women in BR's activities

- Ms. Noha Gaafar briefed the audience on the NoW4WRC process and to what extent this experience has a positive impact on her personally and on other female delegates where women feel a message:"You are not alone" "You can do it".
- It's also important to note that such initiatives make decisions -makers fulfill their obligations in line with them.
- Ms. Noha invited participants of this initiative to be its ambassadors to achieve its ultimate goal.

Session: The experiences of female leaders and role models in WTDC process

- Ms. Reham mentioned that to gain the trust in woman's capabilities, this might takes time.
- She shared her experience on how she struggled to gain such trust.
- Ms. Samira thanked the chair of the chair of the Arb Group for the preparation of WTDC-21 for choosing two female as vice chair.

- She talked about her journey of working with different structures in ITU within the delegation of her country Kuwait and the knowledge and experiences she gained throughout this journey until she got a leadership roles and responsibilities within these structures.
- She highlighted that without ICT no one could cope with COVID-19 and that ICTs is the vehicle for development.
- Mrs. Amel was thankful for the ITU because through her participation as delegate she witnessed progress either on professional or personal level. By getting involved in the ITU structures, she was able to improve her knowledge and to dive deep into research and studies especially when it comes to the study groups. On a personal level, she build relationships and expand horizons by being exposed to different cultures.
- Ms. Aysha highlighted that not only engineers can participate and contribute to this network. Women will sometime find themselves in "first-timer" position – just like she did - , and should not be intimidated because you will find growth in such challenges. Women will also will find a support from men AND women alike, as long as they have have faith in themselves first.

Open discussion on establishment of NOW in Arab Region

- The delegate from Somalia Ms. Naima raised that one of the challenges for new participants like herself is actively contributing to the work of then WTDC especially the work groups, and how would the Network of Women be able to do something about this?
- Other delegate, Ms. Nevine Tewfik from Egypt intervened to highlight the importance of mentorship and to express her willingness to support this network by being one of the mentors.
- Ms. Nagwa Shinnawy proposed to consider to group all the initiatives related to empower women through the ICTs.
- Ms. Christine Arida from Egypt said that it would be great to enable through the Network some vehicle for thematic discussions among women in preparation of the WTDC, especially on topics important to the region.

Summary and Closing session

- Ms. Rouda from the ITU Regional Office for the Arab States provided a closing remark by thanking all for their support. She shared the envisaged process for this network and highlighted that this event is just a start and many activities to come.
- She mentioned that once the secretariat of NoW4WTDC-21 ARAB is established, the network will design its activities including the mentorship programme and the collaboration with other regions towards a more inclusive WTDC-21.
