Context

This Regional Innovation Forum for the Arab States is organized within the framework of the 2021 ITU Global Innovation Forum. Its main aim is to build partnerships that mainstream entrepreneurship-driven innovation and competitive digital ecosystems.

Recovering from — as well as preventing — crises and bridging the digital divide require new partnerships and approaches to close the digital innovation gap. Countries can use this opportunity to transform their communities into thriving and competitive digital economies through accelerating entrepreneurship-driven innovation and focusing on job creation.

The Regional Innovation Forum for the Arab States will empower participants with new approaches, insights, tools, frameworks, communities and relevant case studies to understand how to mainstream sustainable ecosystems that accelerate digital transformation in the Arab States region. The forum's programme builds on ITU's <u>Regional Initiative 5: Innovation and Entrepreneurship</u>, which was adopted by the <u>World Telecommunication Development Conference 2017 (WTDC-17)</u> in Buenos Aires, Argentina.

Objective

This two-day forum aims to build regional and national capacities by identifying, learning, networking and highlighting successful projects and/or initiatives, policies and programmes in developing competitive digital innovation ecosystems.

Each day will have a specific focus:

- Day 1: the forum will examine the state of regional countries' readiness and show practical cases of how key economic sectors can benefit by nurturing digital innovation.
- Day 2: the forum will continue its regional deep dive by sharing good practices, stories of digital change-makers and offering insights for new partnership actions at the regional level.

Participant will learn the "why", "what" and "how" of building new partnerships and initiatives that ensure that communities have the right innovation capabilities to be resilient and competitive with digital technologies.

Who should attend?

This forum targets all stakeholders involved in nurturing digital innovation in the Arab States region. Particularly, this agenda has been customized for the needs of the ICT policy-makers, regulators, tech incubators, national innovation agencies, development agencies, entrepreneurs, ecosystem builders, media, academia as well as institutions willing to undertake a national review on ICT-centric innovation ecosystems and develop sustainable initiatives to accelerate digital transformation in countries.

Expected results

This forum is designed to empower participants from the Arab Sates region with methodologies, frameworks, tools and context-relevant case studies to accelerate digital transformation by promoting competitive digital ecosystems and entrepreneurship-driven innovation. Furthermore, participants will also

	 Overview The intertwined roles of entrepreneurship, innovation and technology are fuelling a paradigm that calls for new thinking and insights. ICT-centric innovation ecosystems have a critical role to play in fostering digital transformation, leading to economic inclusion, positive externalities and sustainable growth for communities, cities and countries. This ecosystem of entrepreneurs, entrepreneurial support organizations, academics, public- and private-sector stakeholders, and financiers are some of the ingredients necessary to fuel a positive digital transformation. Some countries in the Arab States region are able to provide a fertile breeding ground for innovative ideas, whereas in others, many brilliant ideas are not realized due to the lack of an enabling environment. This session will bring together high-level speakers to provide insights about key sector development with technology through tech entrepreneurship. Panellists will discuss the following questions: How is tech entrepreneurship fuelling competitiveness (or the lack thereof) for key sectors with potential in the Arab States region? What are the challenges and opportunities for the digital ecosystem in the region? What new mechanisms or initiatives are needed to accelerate sectoral transformation using a whole-ecosystem approach?

	Overview Vibrant ecosystems require a culture in which stakeholders organically leverage existing resources and continuously update their policies and programmes to remain competitive. Building an innovation culture at the country level is a journey.
	Entrepreneurs who find ideas worth exploring undertake this journey to turn these opportunities into businesses and deliver products and services to the market. A successful journey results in entrepreneurs delivering problem-solving innovations to their communities and regional or global markets. Nevertheless, this success depends on many enabling building blocks — talent, infrastructure, capital, market, culture, policies and an overarching vision and strategy alignment — that provide the key ingredients of robust and vibrant digital innovation ecosystems.
