

European celebration of Girls in ICT 10th anniversary

SELECTION OF ACTIVITIES IN EUROPE

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1. Introduction

International Girls in ICT Day 2021 was celebrated all over the world on and around 22 April 2021. This year is special as it marked the 10 year anniversary of the International Girls in ICT Day, which has been celebrated since 2011. This global initiative, backed by all ITU Member States in ITU Plenipotentiary Resolution 70 (Rev. Busan, 2014), aims to create a global environment that empowers and encourages girls and young women to consider studies and careers in information and communication technologies (ICTs). On International Girls in ICT Day, celebrated every year on the fourth Thursday of April, ITU stakeholders are encouraged to organise activities to commemorate the day and attract more girls and young women to pursue careers in science, technology, engineering, arts and mathematics (STEAM) and ICTs. Since 2011, over 377,000 girls and young women have participated in more than 11,400 International Girls in ICT Day celebrations in 171 countries.

Given the COVID-19 pandemic, many active partners of this global movement including countries of the Europe region, have made remarkable and inspiring efforts to transform their on-site events into exciting virtual activities to celebrate Girls in ICT Day 10th anniversary, thus, effectively demonstrating the power of technology. In Europe, International Girls in ICT Day has been observed in numerous countries by various stakeholders – the public sector, civil society, academia, and private sector organisations, with **94 events across 36 Member States** are being documented. This report provides a selection of activities observed in 36 European countries.

APPROACH

The information presented in this report was collected through reporting and communication received by the ITU from different European stakeholders. Information is presented in alphabetical order by country.

This report is based on the information provided to ITU by the International Girls in ICT Day 2021 event organisers and complemented by online research through search engines and social media platforms. The pictures from the events have been shared with ITU and are used with the permission of the organisers. 2. SELECTION OF ACTIVITIES IN EUROPE

2.1. EUROPEAN CELEBRATION OF GIRLS IN ICT 10-YEAR ANNIVERSARY



In Europe, **94 events across 36 countries** celebrating Girls in ICT Day 2021 are being identified. ITU Office for Europe and EQUALS-EU co-organised <u>"European celebration of Girls in ICT 10-year anniversary"</u> with the support of UN Women, the European Conference of Postal and Telecommunications Administrations (CEPT), the European Commission (EC) and the Regional Cooperation Council (RCC). This virtual celebration was held on 22 April 2021 from 13:30 - 15:30 CEST. The virtual event was followed and viewed by over **1500 individuals** on various livestream channels such as YouTube and Twitter. Over 20 young girls came forward to share their stories, aspirations, and advice to their 10-year-old self.

<u>Generation Connect Europe Youth Group</u> also organized their own celebration by holding an online gathering that focused on discussing and sharing their experiences on the importance of ICTs and pursuing careers in the STEAMs.

NoW National Get Togethers

The celebration continued with a series of national Get-Together meetings led by the Network of Women (NoW) for Europe, taking place in the months of April and May 2021. More than 10 national get togethers were held where discussions around the importance of girls in ICTs as well as women leadership were discussed.

In the context of the Girls in ICT Day, the ITU Office for Europe and Com-ITU of CEPT joined forces to hold a special session on 5 May 2021, led by NoW for Europe. This special meeting aimed at raising awareness to policymakers of the importance of mainstreaming and fostering gender equality. This session also offered an opportunity to discuss the rollout of the European Network of Women (NoW), aiming to engage

women at the national, regional and international level in ITU work.

Other regional events included the <u>International Girls in ICT Day: Solar Panel & Sign Language</u> organized by Cisco Europe, Middle East, Africa, Russia and the <u>International Roundtable for Girls in ICT organized</u> by W-STEM EU.

2.2.3 BELGIUM




To mark the International Girls in ICT Day 2021, EUROCONTROL runs a virtual boot camp on artificial intelligence (AI) in aviation. This event is primarily open to high-school girls studying STEM subjects and is part of EUROCONTROL's strategy to improve diversity and gender balance in the aviation industry. During the boot

camp, the participants explored the challenges and endless possibilities of AI to improve aviation and modern society, being inspired by the career stories of EUROCONTROL's engineers in the field of AI and aviation and working with EUROCONTROL's engineers on imagining and designing an AI-powered digital solution.

2.2.4. BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA

The Communications Regulatory Agency of Bosnia and Herzegovina organised an online panel on the International Girls' Day in ICT on 22 April 2021. The panel discussed, among other things, digital gender equality and overcoming gender inequality in the digital environment. In addition to the Agency's representatives, the meeting was attended by CRA licensees, representatives of BiH Ministries, the Government of the Federation of BiH, the Government of Republika Srpska, the Agency for Preschool, Primary and Secondary Education of BiH, the Center and the Agency for Gender Equality, and representatives of the NGO sector.



During the period 8 April - 22 April, <u>IT Girls</u>, in collaboration with three IT companies, Mistral, Bicom Systems, and Lanaco, created an online competition comprised of 3 online challenges for girls and women, aged 15-20 years old, in simple coding or solving logical problems. The competition was looking to encourage girls and women to use logic or simple coding in solving puzzles or problems. The competition culminated with the awarding ceremony and marking of the Girls in ICT Day. An online event was organised on 22 April 2021 when the Girls in ICT Day Online challenge winners were announced, and the awarding ceremony being held.

2.2.5. BULGARIA

Network of Women (NoW) Bulgaria organised a national Get-Together, held within the framework of the European Network of Women. The Get Together reflected on Girls in ICTs Day as well as the importance of this network in supporting women and girls to



pursue or switch to careers in the STEAMs.

2.2.6. CROATIA



For the 10th year in a row, KING ICT celebrated Girls in ICT Day on 22 April 2021. KING ICT hosted online lectures and workshops where female experts from KING ICT shared their knowledge with girls to stimulate them to recognise the wealth

of opportunities offered by the ICT world. The event started with an online lecture where KING ICT's project leaders shared their experiences and educational path with girls, explaining the nature of their work, followed by a workshop that aimed to familiarise girls with business analysis roles in developing proposed solutions for a simple application. Girls are divided into groups, and each group assigned a mentor who guided them towards a solution.

2.2.7. CZECH REPUBLIC

Gender Studies o.p.s., an NGO based in Prague, has been holding a special event celebrating Girls in ICT Day for ten years. This year on 22 April, despite the COVID-19 pandemic, more than 140 young girls (between the ages of 15–25) participated in varied online programmes from partner ICT companies in the Czech Republic. This year, the event encouraged girls to try new skills and engage in various creative technologies through online workshops and talks on creative coding, software development, 3D virtual reality, construction, electrical design and

2.2.9. ESTONIA

Women in Tech (WiT) Finland held an online discussion "WiT Breakfast Date: Redefined 21st century – Mapping out the new territory at Accenture" on 27 April 2021. The online event, with futurist Perttu Pölönen, Accenture Liquid Studio Helsinki Lead Karoliina Hagman and Design Director at Fjord Stéphanie Del Rey, discussed the technology and design trends that will shape the future. Each year, Accenture extensively crowdsources trends in business, technology, and design from different parts of the world to create the Fjord Trends report, which focuses on how people, organisations, and brands meet human needs.

2.2.11. FRANCE



On the occasion of Girls in ICT Day, LYDEXPERIENCE organised a women leadership workshop under the theme "Digital: an opportunity for the employment and leadership of young women", which took place on Thursday, 22 April 2021, from 10:30 a.m. to 12 p.m. (Paris time). The workshop targeted young women who want to develop their leadership and knowledge on job and career opportunities offered by the digital world. All participants who successfully completed the training were given a certificate, a training course certified by the United Nations and the Ministry in charge of women's rights.

During the event, one of the panellists, Rapper Liser, also presented her two songs from her debut album.

2.2.13. GREECE

On the occasion of International Girls in ICT Day 2021,
Socialinnov organised Girls in ICT week, held under the auspices of the General Secretariat for Demographic and Family Policy and Gender Equality.
Socialinnov



dedicated the week of April 19-23 with a special program that includes a talk for teachers, parents,

and students, as well as four workshops dedicated exclusively to students aged 10-18 who want to take their first steps in the field of ICT. The four workshops focused on planning and enhancing students' skills to encourage them to pursue a study or career in ICT.

Workshops are held at Reykjavík University by the women's association in computer science and teachers in the computer science department and the technology and engineering department. The workshop subjects took various kinds, for example, programming and website design with the languages of web design, HTML and CSS, the structure of computer games, three-dimensional printing of organs, and fracture resistance of bones. After the workshops, participants were visiting technology companies where they are given an insight into the activities and the opportunities that girls are offered in the labour market after completing technical studies.

Girls and women shared experiences, models of innovation, and food for thought to inspire young girls and women for STEM careers. The event attended by many esteemed professionals from the world of ICT who will



unhinge preconceptions and put their stories at the service of dissemination and knowledge, to demonstrate that overcoming gendered challenges in the professional world is possible. During the event, several topics were discussed, including female entrepreneurship and job opportunities in the ICT sector, social innovation and female empowerment, an overview of the ICT labour market and women's engagement, education and empowerment in technology, and digital strategies and social networks.

In addition, the club carried out a virtual activity to learn what ICT are and basic programming concepts in an interactive way. The event, which was dedicated to children aged 8-12 years old, is expected

to inspire girls to work in the ICT field and guide them to be tech creator.

For the tenth year in a row, KING ICT celebrated Girls in ICT Day.
This year, KING ICT marked the day with online lectures and workshops where king's experts shared their knowledge with girls and encouraged them to recognise the opportunities offered by the ICT world. Project managers, testers, and analysts will bring girls closer to their



educational path and the nature of the workplace. After the lecture, workshops took place in order to introduce the participants to the role of business analysis by developing solutions for a simple application. The girls were divided into groups, and each group received a mentor who guided them and helped them come to a solution. With the desire to inspire and empower the girls with their own experience, the Kings showed girls that it is really possible to achieve a successful career in the ICT industry.

On the occasion of Girls in ICT Day 2021, IT'S HER GAME held an online conference for Polish female teenagers and young adults who are interested in a career in ICT with a focus on the sectors of gaming, game tech, and esports. The event is a vital part of a strategy focused on building the role models of women who have already been successful in this sector and giving the next generation of future leaders global career perspectives. The event is aimed to bring the IT'S HER GAME podcast guests and other female professionals from the technology world of gaming closer to the Polish listeners and giving them a chance to ask questions. The event consisted of guests'



keynotes, panel sessions, live Q&A, and individual sessions, for which participants have signed up in advance.

2.2.26. PORTUGAL

To mark the 10th anniversary of the International Day of Girls in ICT, the Government of Portugal



launched the <u>Girls in ICT Week</u> under the Engenheiras Por Um Dia Project, which took place from 22-29 April 2021. Various online activities for sharing knowledge, experiences, and clarifying doubts were being held, involving the project's partners from various entities and higher education institutions. The week kicked off with a webinar "International Girls' Day in ICT: Conversations about Technology", on 22 April 2021, organised by the Secretary of State for Citizenship and Equality (SECI), the InCoDe.2030 program, the Commission for Citizenship and Gender Equality (CIG), and by .PT. Girl in ICT Week is part of the government's objective of reversing the trend of reducing the participation of girls and women in ICT

and engineering.

The National Association of Teachers of Informatics (ANPRI)

celebrated Girls in ICT Day by organising an online gathering that intended to discuss the issue of the lack of women in professional and higher education courses in ICT. During the gathering, panellists and participants shared their concerns, ideas, possibilities, actions, and strategies to increase women participation in ICT.

2.2.27. ROMANIA

<u>Women in Data Science (WiDS) Romania</u> organised a conference featuring more than 40 women data scientists from all sectors: industry, government, academia, and civil society. The conference's

sessions centred around topics such as Smarter Cities, Supply chain management, Public Policies based on data science, e-Health, implementation of Ethics in AI, current EU trends, How Data Science will Impact The Labour Market and Education, OLAP, Data Mining and Business Intelligence, The importance of Data Privacy related to the usage of AI and big data analytics, and included advice from practitioners on how to become a data scientist.

2.2.28. SERBIA

This year, the Association of Business Women in Serbia celebrated Girls in ICT Day for the 10th time. As an association that supports women's entrepreneurship, ABW Serbia organised three main activities for the celebration: 1) Competition for the best video "Catch the Idea" made by schoolgirls; 2) Online visits of schoolgirls to the most eminent ICT and women-owned companies in Serbia; and

3) Creation and publication of a promotional short film about this year's activities. More than 400



schoolgirls from 80 primary schools in Serbia participated in these activities. These activities were aimed to encourage and motivate schoolgirls in the final grades of primary schools to choose their career

options regardless of gender stereotypes. The ABW Serbia Girls in ICT Day project is institutionally supported by the Government of the Republic of Serbia and the Prime Minister, who is the Honorary Patron of the event.

2.2.29. SLOVAK REPUBLIC

Aj Ty v IT organised Girls' Day 2021 on 22 April 2021 as part of the celebrations of the International

Girls in ICT Day. In Slovakia, the celebration has been covered by the civic association Aj Ty v IT since 2014. The event aimed to introduce the world of IT and modern technologies to girls aged 15-19 and to show them what opportunities for study,



work, or business the sector offers. On this day, ICT organisations, companies, and universities were opening their gates to high school students all over Slovakia to provide a closer look into this dynamically developing sector and assess the possible future career in the ICT sector.

<u>The ATHENA European University</u> publishes motivational quotes for girls, prepared by women and girls from STEM, on the ATHENA webpage in the period from International Day of Women and Girls in Science (11 February 2021) over International Women's Day (8 March 2021) to International Girls in ICT Day (22 April 2021) and International Women in Engineering Day (23 June 2021).

<u>The City Library of Krani</u> launched a project, <u>"Technophobia is not for women"</u>, to get a deeper understanding of the advantages and challenges that women face in the field of science and technology. With the help of a consultation group, the project aims to identify and support the needs of the local and broader community by offering education, workshops, and other events to encourage women to participate in the scientific and technology sector.

2.2.31. SPAIN

In collaboration with various public and private institutions, the Galician Supercomputing Center

2.2.34. TURKEY

On the occasion of Girls in ICT Day, on 22 April 2021, a short virtual get together was organized by women professionals at ICTA/BTK (the Turkish Information and Communication Technologies Authority) to discuss informally the key challenges that girls face today when willing to pursue careers in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEMs). During the event, junior women



colleagues had the chance to come together with the high-level women seniors at managerial positions to hear their experiences and share ideas.



BTK Academy, which was established in 2017 as the training centre of the Information and Communication Technologies Authority (ICTA-BTK) of Turkey, provides several pieces of training to children and youth, including robotics coding, phyton programming, ThinkerCad 3D design, drone algorithm, entrance to AI, C# programming. On the occasion of Girls

in ICT Day, online scratch coding training for girls between the ages of 10-12 was organized by the BTK Academy on 22 April 2021. This training aimed to raise awareness for girls that robotic coding is an understandable and applicable field, to enable girls to discover their potential in programming and offer an alternative in their plans in the age of technology.

2.2.35. UKRAINE

In honour of International Girls 'Day in ICT, 22 April, CSR Ukraine, an expert organization of the



Center for CSR Development, and its initiative #GirlsSTEM held an online conference with inspiring women "Girls' Day in ICT" (information and communication technologies). The event was part of the UNFPA project "Springboard for Equality", the United Nations Population Fund in Ukraine with the financial support of Sweden. For 10 hours, experts from leading Ukrainian and international companies and organizations spoke

about the field of ICT and its achievements over the past ten years gave valuable advice on starting and building a career in ICT, creativity, modern skills and women's leadership, dispelled myths about women in this field and even conducted an interactive JavaScript workshop.

From 14 April to 14 May 2021, on the occasion of the International Girls in ICT Day, Cisco Networking Academy and leading universities of Ukraine invited schoolgirls of 8–11 grades and female students of colleges and institutions of vocational (technical) education to join online marathon Girls Power Tech 2021. The event was part of the All-Ukrainian Festival "STEM-Spring 2021" with the support of the Ministry of Education and



Science of Ukraine. For the tenth year in a row, Cisco has organized mass events for young people on the occasion of International Girls in ICT Day.


2.2.36. UNITED KINGDOM
