- European Commission priorities 2019-2024
 - European Green Deal
 - Europe fit for the digital Age

Twin Green and Digital transition

- Cities and Comunities nearly all population and economic activity
- Address citiezens', cities' and environmental needs and problems (areas such as mobility, energy, etc.)



Living-in.EU

- Encompassing and building up on all digital activities for cities and communities from the previous financial period
- Political Declaration: over 80 signatories and some 40 supporters
- Principles:
 - A citizen-centric approach
 - a city-led approach at EU level
 - the city as a citizen-driven and open innovation ecosystem
 - ethical and socially responsible access, use, sharing and management of data
 - technologies as key enablers
 - interoperable digital platforms based on open standards and technical specifications, Application Programming Interfaces (APIs) and shared data models


LI.EU Tech Group
