Caribbean Spectrum Management (CSM)

- This is Phase 2 of the project
- Phase 1 2006 2009:
 - Initiated the CSM Task Force and Steering Committee
 - Face to face and on-line training in national spectrum management
 - Face to face training in spectrum pricing
 - Field audits of spectrum management practices and operations in 7 countries
 - Produced the Caribbean Spectrum Management Policy Framework which was approved by GC10 for presentation to member states
 - Preliminary work on a Caribbean Indicative Spectrum Allocation Table

Caribbean Spectrum Management (CSM)

- For Phase 2 (2012 2016):
 - Reconvene SMSC and SMTF permanently
 - Update spectrum management policy framework with:
 - harmonised approaches to digital switchover / dividend
 - harmonised policy for disaster communications
 - Interference mitigation & resolution framework
 - Completed Caribbean Indicative Table of Spectrum Allocations
 - Automated Caribbean SM database
 - Regional spectrum pricing policy framework
 - A Caribbean amateur radio certification regime
 - Further development of regional expertise



Caribbean Spectrum Management (CSM)

- Current / Next Steps:
 - Project proposal formulated for 2012 2016 to incorporate the future goals
 - Seeking funding from relevant prospective sources for major components or entire project
 - Met in Nov 2011 in POS with ITU's Director Radiocommunication Bureau
 - Proceeding pragmatically as resources allow (human and financial)

 A network of content creators, providers, network operators and other stakeholders to integrate databases of available content from participants


Why a CEDUNET?
