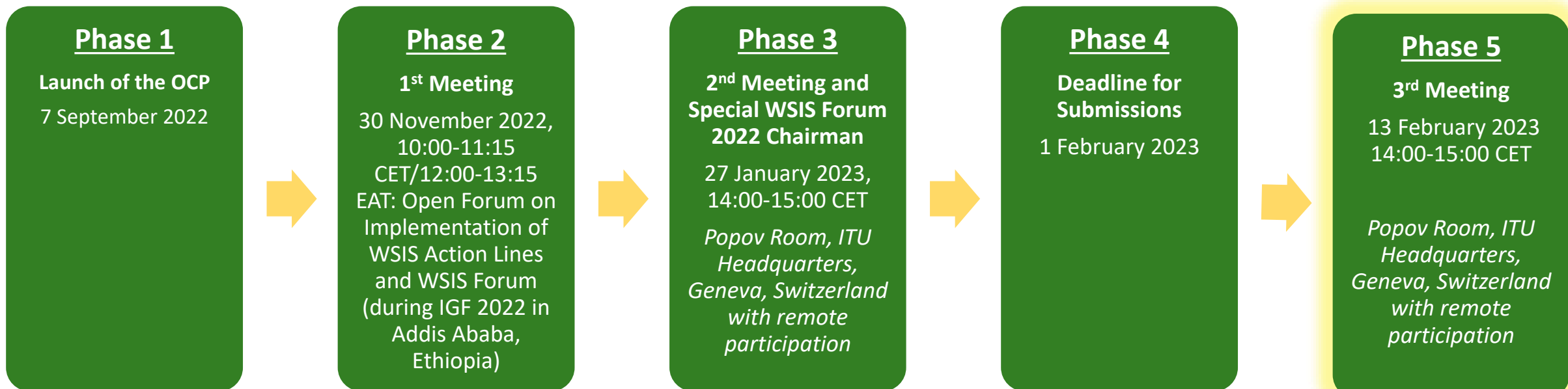

# Open Consultation Process

The **Open Consultation process (OCP)** aims at ensuring a **participatory and inclusive spirit of the Forum**. This process actively engages multistakeholders in the preparatory process to ensure broad ownership and further improvements of the Forum. The Open Consultation Process will include a collection of inputs from regional and national WSIS related events.

The Open Consultation Process for the WSIS Forum 2023 is structured in five phases as follows:



## Registration Process for on-site participation

The WSIS Forum 2023 is scheduled to be held from 13–17 March 2023 at the ITU Headquarters in Geneva, with the support of remote participation. Virtual workshops will continue in April & May. The Forum is open to all WSIS stakeholders.

**ITU Membership:** Delegates who are part of the ITU Membership (Administration Member States, Resolution 99, ITU Sector Members) can log-in with their ITU User Account/TIES; their requests will be sent for validation to the WSIS accreditation team, or their Delegate Focal Point. Further information may be requested to new delegates from an ITU Membership, if deemed necessary.

**Non-ITU Members:** Participants from organizations non-members of ITU (ex. Civil society, NGOs, Private sector that are not part of the ITU Membership, etc.) will be prompted to fill out the [e-questionnaire](#) for accreditation, accessible [here](#) or during the registration process once the registration form has been submitted.

Accreditation requests should be submitted as soon as possible and no later than 21 February 2023 so as to ensure timely administrative processing of the requests. Please note that the ITU reserves the right to request further documents to each participant if it deems necessary.

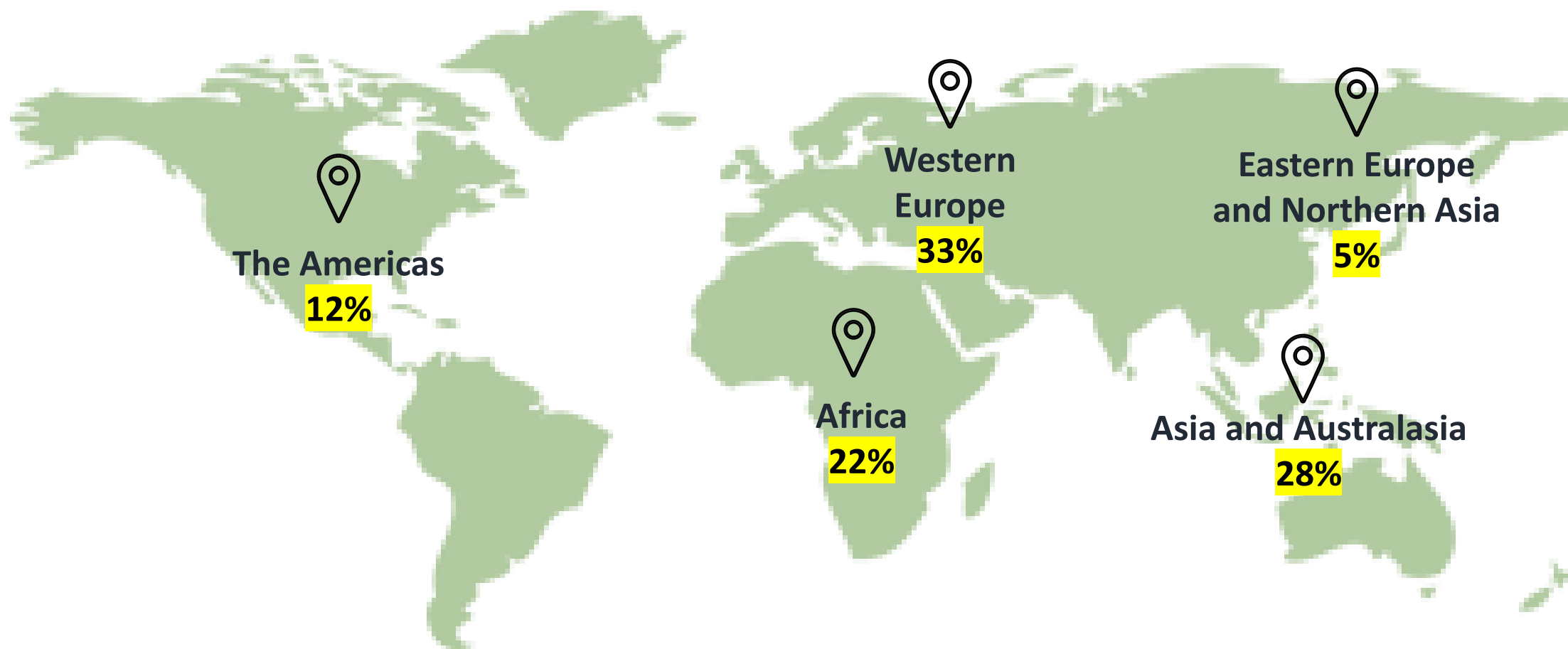


# Results of the OCP

- Innovative and constructive submissions received during direct official submissions, online discussions and physical meetings.
- Agenda and program are crowdsourced and designed in collaboration with the multistakeholder community on the basis of the submissions received during the OCP.
- Highest number of submissions received from Government (23%), International Organizations (21%), Civil Society (20%), Academia (17%), Private Sector (15%) and Others (4%).
- Enhanced participation from the wider community, including parliamentarians, youth, women and older persons.
- Enrich the dialogue, networking and partnership



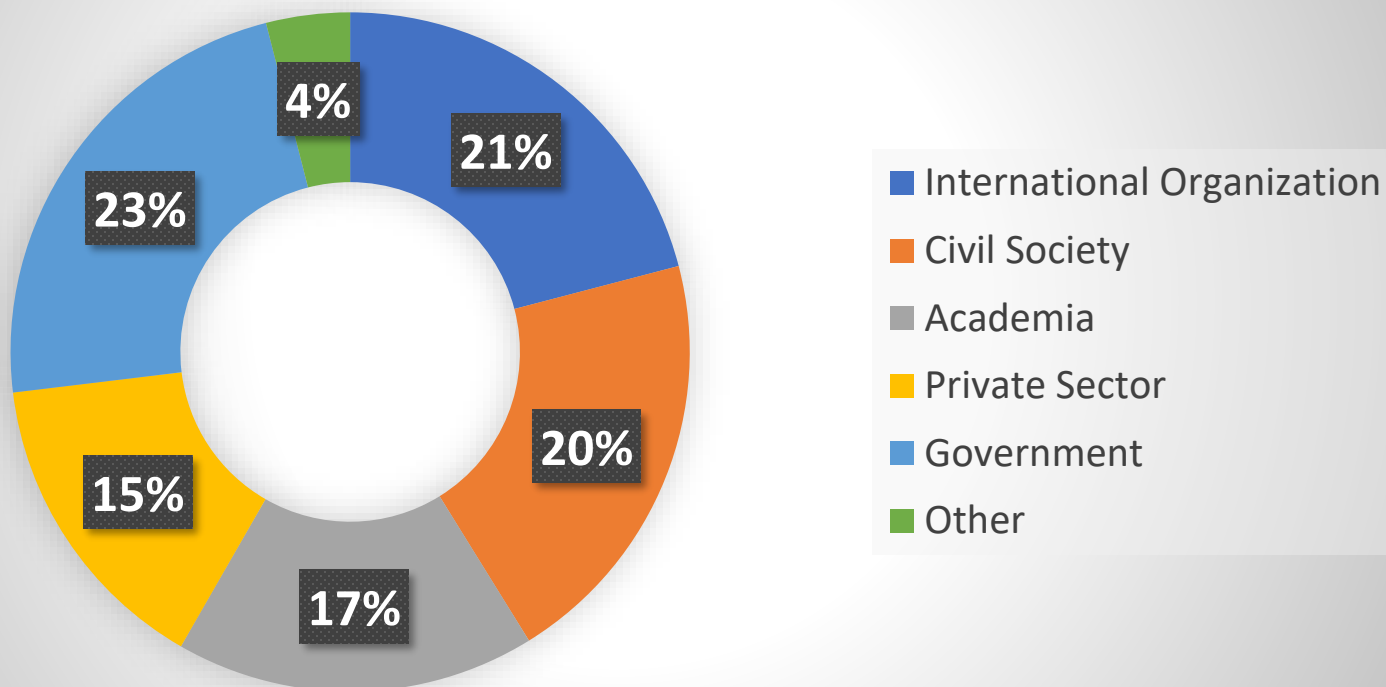

# Suggestions on strengthening the outcomes

- Each annual Forum should continue producing a consolidated document containing the outcomes of each session to provide a summary of the discussions.
- Result-focused approach for each session should be applied. All sessions should be explicitly linked to the WSIS Action Lines and the SDGs.
- WSIS Action Lines should present a concise annual progress report consisting of emerging trends, statistics and supplemented by case studies, if necessary, to be presented during the WSIS Action Line Facilitation Meetings and forwarded to the UN follow ups of WSIS and SDG processes.
- Annual report and sharing of examples of global best practices through the WSIS Stocktaking.
- Annual review by Partnership on Measuring ICT for Development might enrich monitoring of implementation of the WSIS outcomes.
- Pre-WSIS Forum national and regional meetings that then feed into the annual WSIS Forum in Geneva.
- Further collaboration and implementation of the WSIS Action lines and SDGs Matrix.





# Suggestions on strengthening the WSIS Forum for the SDGs implementation and the 2030 Agenda

- The WSIS Forum is an annual opportunity to benchmark progress, share success stories and learning experiences and incentivize further action on ICTs for sustainable development.
- The WSIS Forum can provide a space for stakeholders to exchange and nurture collaboration in the implementation of SDGs, in line with the UN SG Our Common Agenda, the Roadmap on Digital Cooperation and in support and complement to the Global Digital Compact.
- Content creation and the maintenance of interactive, accessible-to-all and multilingual content relating to the ICTs as well as aspirations and goals of the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable on the dedicated WSIS webpage.
- To develop a methodology and a reporting framework to monitor the implementation of the concrete actions taken by stakeholders. This would enable stakeholders to measure their impact and provide a clear and transparent communication on the contributions of the WSIS Forum to the SDG.
- Increase involvement with all stakeholders, including civil society, policymakers, entrepreneurs and startups that are visioning, designing and implementing approaches and solutions that assist with achieving the 2030 agenda, as well as technical standards development bodies.
- Increase the focus on action and progress. Enhance the monitoring and measuring of the SDGs and the WSIS Action Lines.

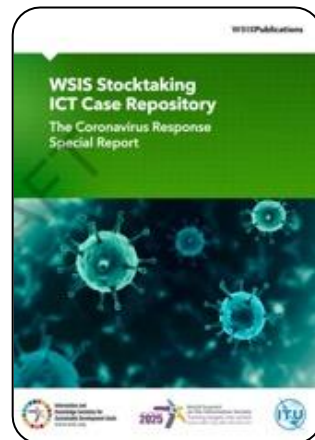
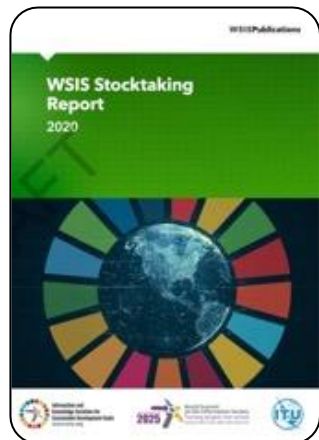


# WSIS Stocktaking: 2022-2023 Call for New Entries

Publicly accessible WSIS Stocktaking database [www.wsis.org/stocktaking](http://www.wsis.org/stocktaking) currently with 15,000+ submitted projects and initiatives from 350,000+ registered stakeholders has been vigilant and started collecting projects and activities on how ICTs are assisting stakeholders in their everyday life, work, and combating challenges caused by the coronavirus pandemic.

UN General Assembly called for a close alignment between the WSIS process and the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development: WSIS Stocktaking is highlighting the contribution of 11 WSIS Action Lines to the achievement 17 SDGs.

ECOSOC resolution 2022/15 reiterates the importance of sharing best practices at the global level and encourages all stakeholders to submit ICT-related projects and initiatives to the WSIS Stocktaking platform.

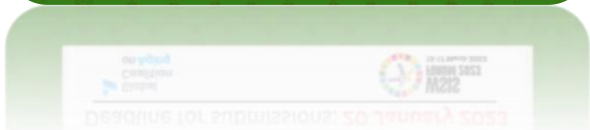

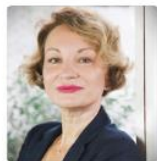
