Information and communication technologies (ICTs) have become integral to the delivery of quality health-care services. Visit the WHO eHealth pavilion to see an exhibition demonstrating how ICTs are transforming health care. With the theme "eHealth through the life course", the pavilion exhibits technologies, software and systems designed for developing countries. Exhibitors include NGOs, universities and the private sector and cover topics such as public health (e.g., surveillance), health services delivery, and special applications. Large screens and an internet connection to remote sites enable short demonstrations on telemedicine, e-learning, use of mobile technologies and a real-time "view from the field".

The pavilion is also host to the eHealth Side Forum, where visitors are invited to join information sessions, technology demonstrations and discussions on eHealth, along the following themes:

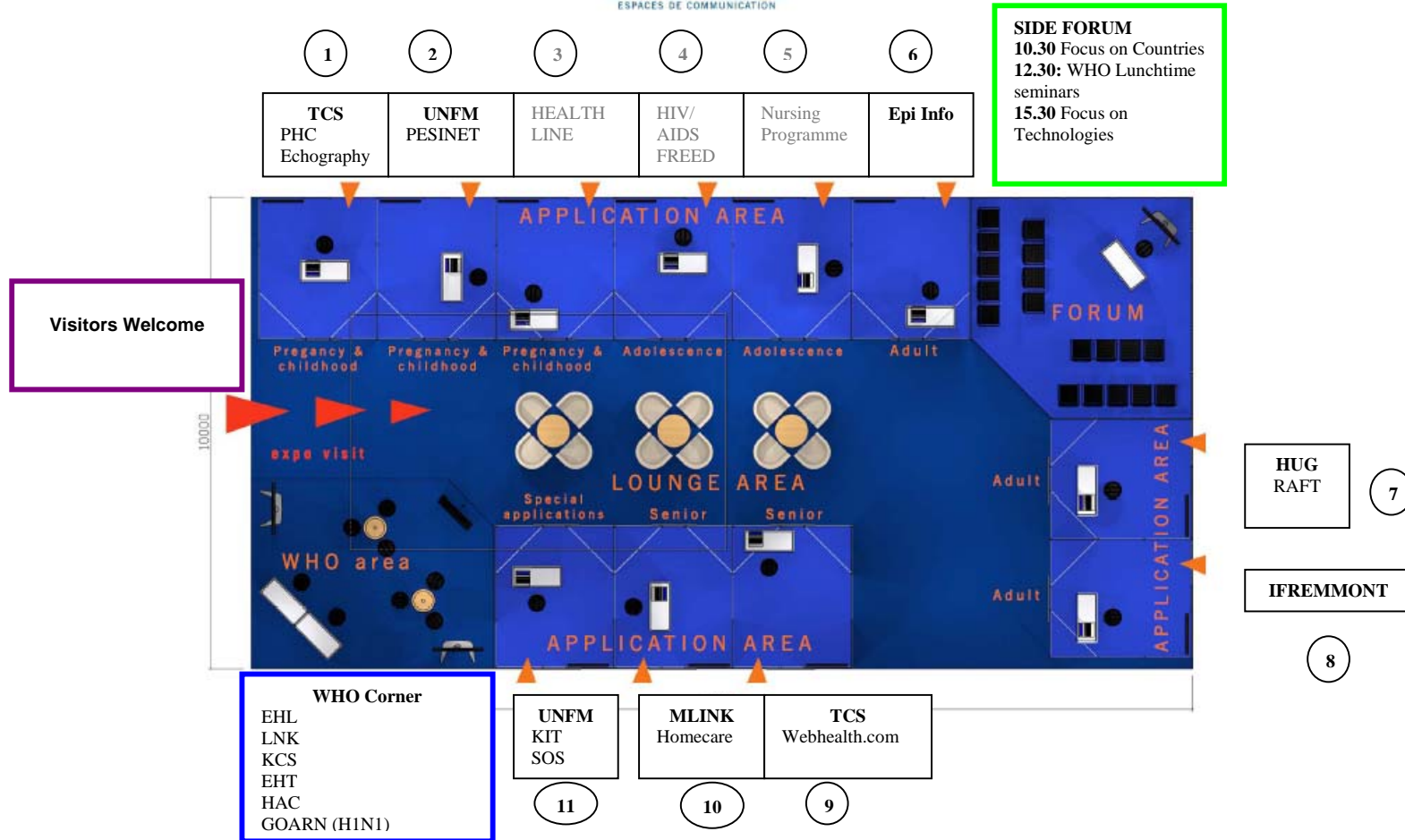
