

## International Telecommunication Union (ITU)

- UN Specialized Agency for telecommunications
- Oldest inter-governmental organization (established in 1865 and part of the UN family since 1947)
- o Global organization with broad membership
  - 189 Member States and
  - 600+ sector members
- Triple global mandate
  - 1. Coordinate use of radio-communications resources (frequencies, satellite orbits, etc.)
  - 2. Establish global telecom standards
  - 3. Promote the development of ICT sector worldwide











## WSIS: Global Platform for Digital Opportunities

- Under the high patronage of UN Secretary-General, with ITU taking the lead role, in cooperation with other UN agencies
- Presence of more than 60 Heads of State and Government, Executive Heads of UN agencies, industry leaders, NGOs, media and civil society in a single high-level event
- Coordination of roles of the various partners in practical establishment of the information society around the globe
- Geneva 2003: Phase 1, 10-12 December will adopt Declaration of Principles and Plan of Action
- Tunis 2005: Phase 2, 16-18 November assess progress and adopt any further Plan of Action
