## Objectives

**Our goal is to review :**

**High roaming prices in the Arab countries**

**Solutions for uncompetitive prices**

**Regulatory actions to end excessive charges for international mobile roaming**

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## Mobile Market Size

- **There are 22 Arab countries that include 45 mobile operators**
- **2 Arab Counties didn't declare any roaming agreements**
- **Due to lack of Data analysis were held on 7 Arab countries.**

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## Scope of study

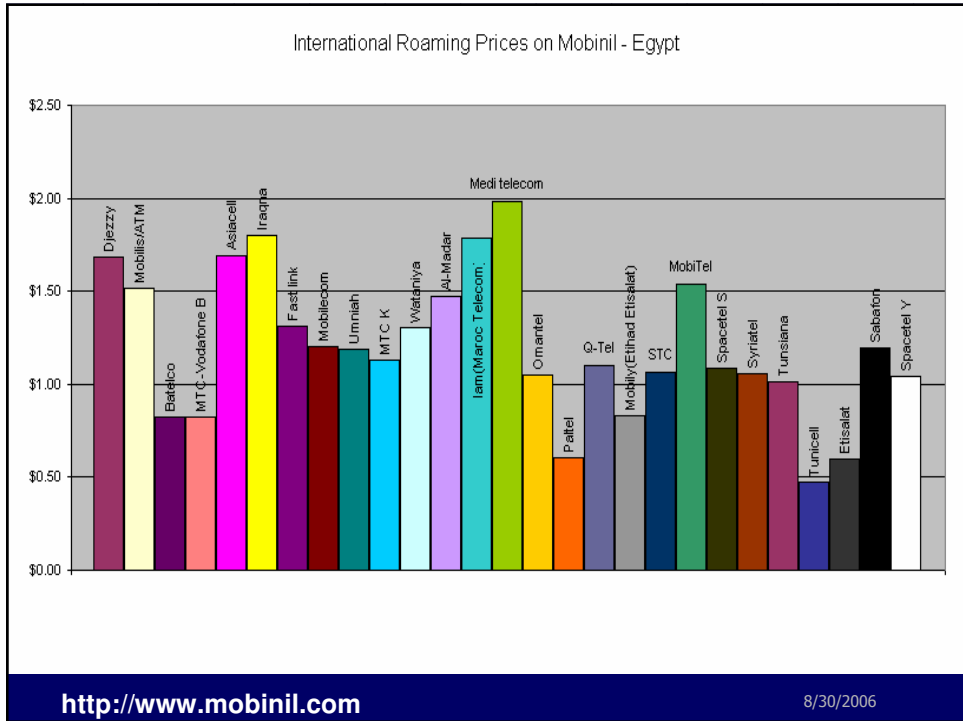
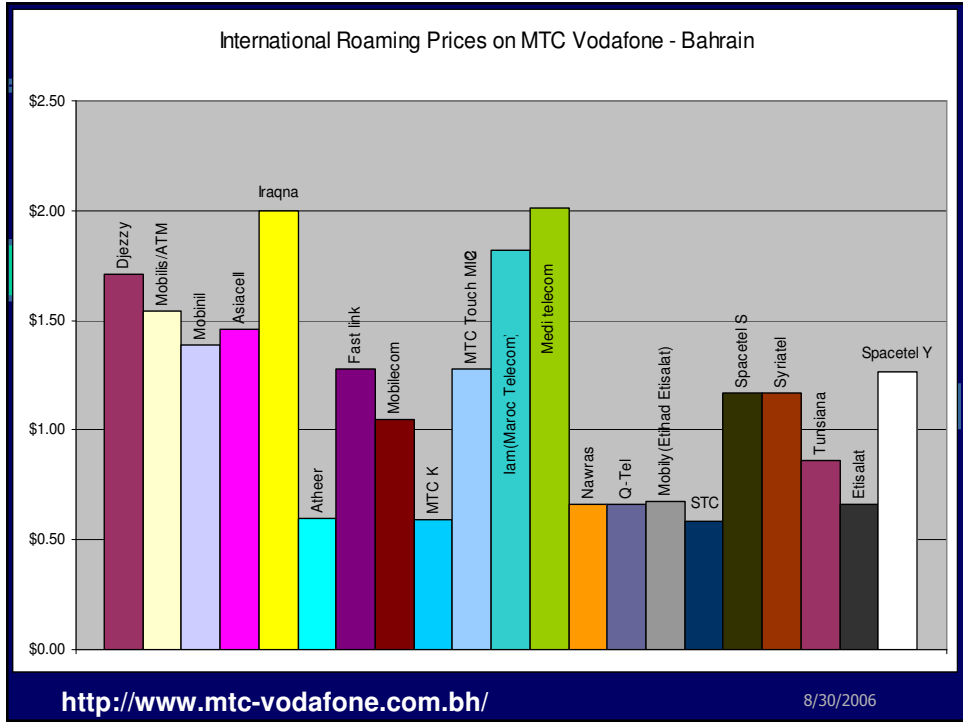
- Study includes 2 types of roamed calls:
  - International roamed call is a call made by a subscriber roaming on a visited network to someone in another country
  - Domestic roamed calls is a call made by a subscriber roaming on a visited network to another person in the country of the visited network

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## First: International Roamed Call Prices:

- Analysis is for International Outgoing call to home country.

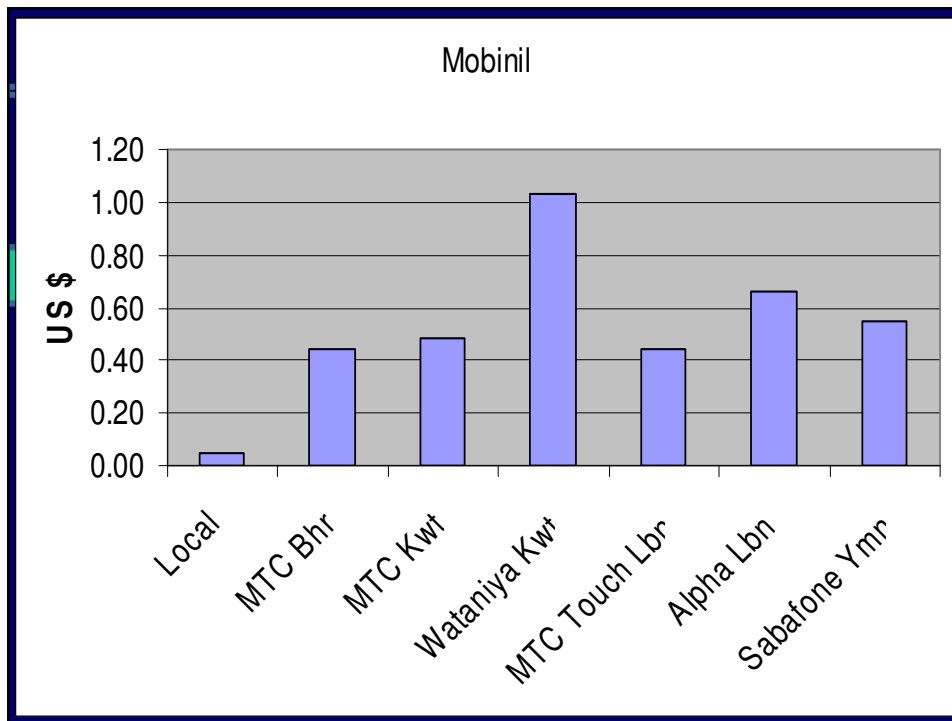
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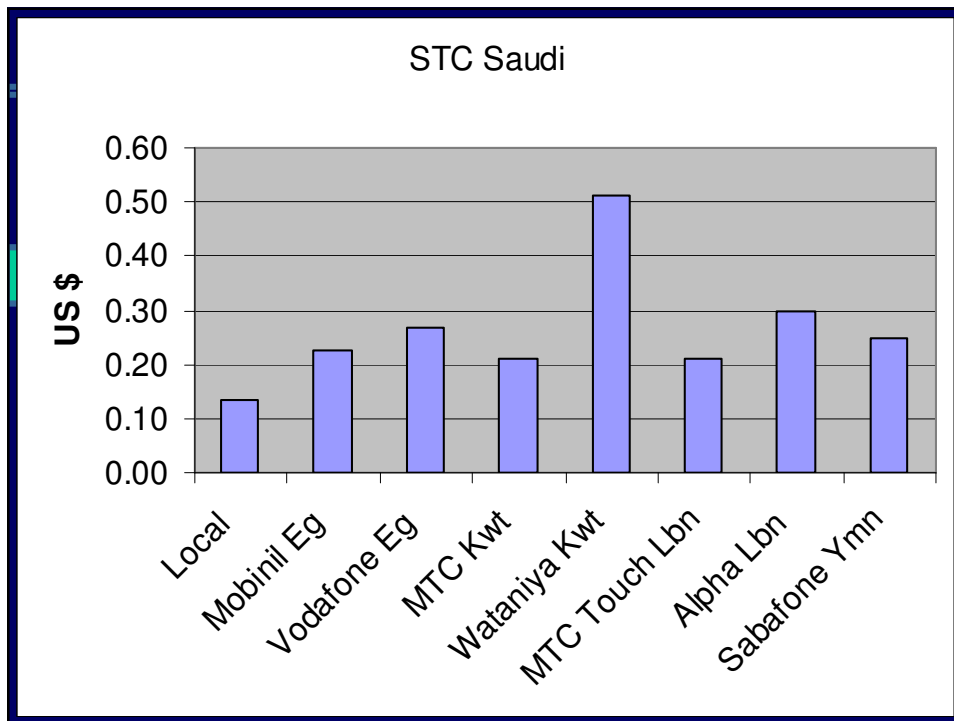
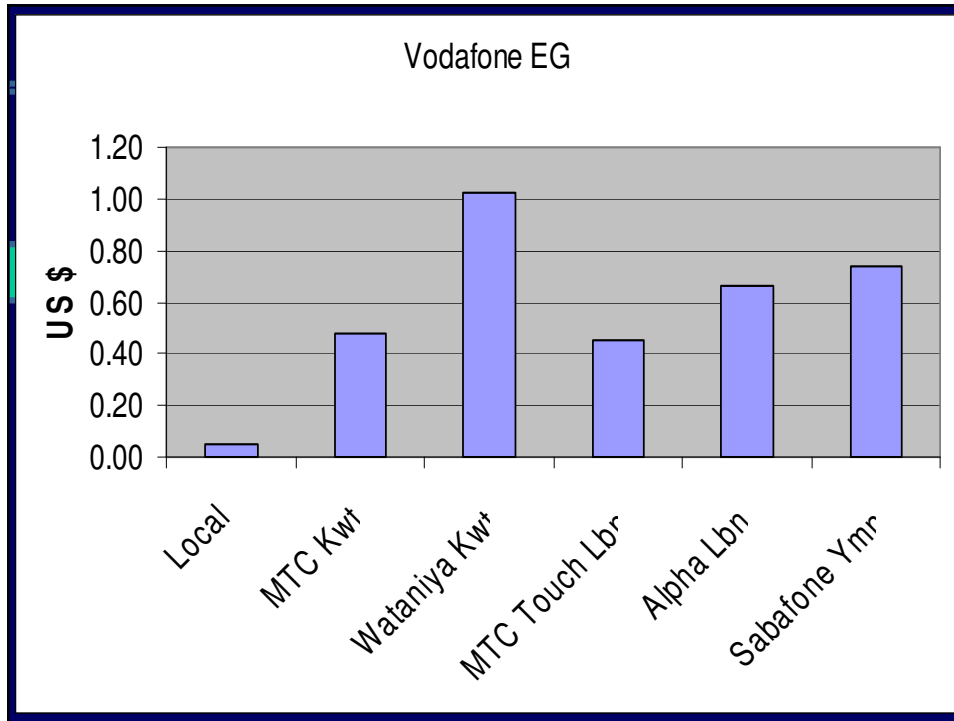


## Second: Domestic Roamed Call Prices:

- A local roamed call is a call made by a subscriber roaming on a visited network to another person in the country of the visited network.
- The called person may be:
  - A mobile subscriber of the visited network
  - A mobile subscriber on another licensed mobile network in the same country
  - A fixed network subscriber in the same country

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## Study Summary

- Variation in p/min of Arab international roaming calls to home country from lowest to highest ranges from 200% to 1000%, which indicates great variability in roaming prices among countries.
- Also, local roaming calls p/min is 5-15 times higher than regular local calls p/min which shows a huge difference in calls within the same country.

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## Roaming Pricing Components:

<b>Wholesale roaming pricing</b>	<b>Retail roaming pricing</b>
<b>Inter Operator Tariff (IOT)</b> Def, Application duration, change in IOT	<b>End-users</b>
<b>Mobile originated calls</b> Charged by who, pricing factors	<b>Mobile originated calls</b> Who charges it? On what basis, who pays for it?
<b>Mobile terminated calls</b> Charged by who	<b>Mobile terminated calls</b> Who charges it? On what basis, who pays for it?

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## Customers Perspective

- Prices charged for mobile users are unsatisfactory .
- Hardly anybody knows the details of the different roaming charges and they can be very difficult to find. They are also changed frequently.
- The prices differences between different networks are vast, even within the same country.

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## Regulation

we conclude that causes of high charges are :

- Absence of real competition
- Absence of regulation of international roaming
- Strong disincentive on operators to negotiate lower prices

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## Solutions

- **Improving Public Awareness: Launch a section on ARNET website on roaming prices in the Arab region and to be updated every 6 months.**
- **Each Regulator review IOT of its home country operators, to ensure fairness and consumer welfare.**
- **A regulated imposed inter-Arab IOT rate (regulation driven)**
- **Enabling the Optimized Routing and billing users accordingly (fairness driven)**

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## Results

- **As the study was submitted to the Council of Arab Ministers for ICT - the Council - during its meeting in June 2006 - decided that:**
- **"Arab regulators, on the national level, shall put obligations on mobile operators in their respective countries to:**
  - 1- lower their international mobile roaming retail tariff starting form 01/01/2007 to a level that is appropriate and acceptable in accordance with the global norms, with the possibility of negotiating bilateral agreements between operators to lower the inter-operator tariffs**
  - 2- announce to the roamer, via SMS, the prices of international mobile roaming upon arrival in the visited country ",**
