
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- Telecommunications Regulators' Association of Southern Africa (TRASA) – Association of telecommunications regulators from 14 Southern African countries.
- 2. TRASA Emanates from the Southern Africa Development Community (SADC), a regional trading organisation intent on fostering a stable and attractive environment for investment in Southern Africa.
- 3. TRASA Inaugurated in Dar-es-Salaam on 15 September 1997.
- 4. Founding members Botswana, Mozambique, Namibia, South Africa, Tanzania and Zambia.
- 5. Currently 11 full members out of 14 SADC member states.







6. TRASA's Objectives :- To harmonise the regional telecommunications regulatory framework and coordinate recommendations to policy-making structures in SADC Member States.

TRASA Structures:

- 7. The AGM is the organisation's supreme body.
- 8. Executive Committee (Chairperson, 2 Vice Chairpersons and the host of TRASA Secretariat).
- Five committees responsible for: Licensing and Universal Service, Interconnection and Tariffs, Numbering and Standards, Human Resource Development and Empowerment, Technology and Advanced Services.

- The SADC Model Telecommunications Policy (1998).
- The SADC Model Telecommunications Legislation (1998).
- The SADC interconnection and tariffs guidelines (2000).
- The SADC Regional Radio Frequency Band Plan [200 ?].
- 11. Adopted a 5-year Strategic Business Plan (2000).
- 12. Working on the Universal Service and Licensing guidelines.
- 13. TRASA has been requested to give its model to other regions aspiring to establish similar regional bodies.

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
