James Bryce Clark is the Director of Standards Development at OASIS. He joined the consortium's professional staff in 2003, and is responsible for supervising the operations and output of 60+ OASIS technical committees.

Jamie chaired the Electronic Commerce Subcommittee of the American Bar Association's business law section for four years, and was primary author of its revised Model Trading Partner Agreement. He has served as expert delegate for the United States in the e-commerce working group of the United Nations Commission on International Trade Law (UNCITRAL) since 2000.

Jamie started practicing law with Shearman & Sterling at 53 Wall Street in New York City in 1988. Before joining OASIS, he was a partner in a Los Angeles corporate law firm, and general counsel to a healthcare e-commerce consultancy. He was a contributor and co-editor of the original business process specifications for the ebXML project (now ISO TS 15000), and chairman of ebXML's joint coordinating committee in 2001-02. He holds JD and BSc degrees from the University of Minnesota.
