Introduction

An ITU-T workshop – New Horizons for Security Standardization – will take place at ITU Headquarters, in Geneva, on 3 and 4 October 2005.

Objectives

The overall objectives of the workshop are to help advance the IT security standardization work and to promote increased co-operation between organizations engaged in the development of security standards.

In particular, the workshop will:

- Provide an overview of key security standardization activities in ITU-T, ISO and IETF as well as various consortia and regional standards development organizations (SDOs);
- Seek to find out from stakeholders (e.g. network operators, system developers, users, etc.) their primary security concerns/issues (including possible issues of adoption or implementation of standards);

- Try to determine which issues are amenable to a standards solution and how the SDOs can most effectively play a role in helping address these issues;
- Identify which SDOs are already working on these issues or are best equipped to do so; and
- Consider how SDOs can collaborate to improve the timeliness and effectiveness of security standards and avoid duplication of effort.

Written contributions are also invited on any of the programme topics or closely-related topics. This will permit those who are not able to attend the workshop and those who do not feel able to speak on a topic to contribute. Copies of the written contributions will be made available in the workshop proceedings.

There is no charge for participation in the workshop but advance registration is required.
