The IEC, ISO and ITU,

Recalling the past World Smart City Forum events and Standards Organizations Workshops;

Noting the following action items that have been identified from these past events:

1. SOs to share and promote the World Smart City goals and Forum outcomes with cities' networks through our respective members and relevant associations
2. International standards bodies CEOs and key decision makers to meet to agree a course of action to supporting smart cities development in line with our joint commitment
3. International standards bodies to investigate the possibility of creating one joint IEC-ISO-ITU definition of smart city
4. International standards bodies to approve the development of the smart cities definitions presented by the joint IEC-ISO-ITU terminology group and to receive feedback from the interested SOs present at the workshop
5. International standards bodies to investigate the creation of a smart cities standards mapping considering for example existing initiatives such as JCA-IoT and SC&C in ITU-T and the Smart Cities Systems Committee in IEC and to receive feedback from the interested SOs present at the workshop

The creation of a joint IEC-ISO-ITU Smart Cities Task Force (J-SCTF) is submitted for approval by each organization.

Mandate and scope of the Joint IEC-ISO-ITU Smart Cities Task Force (J-SCTF):

- To build synergies and to promote minimization of overlap as applicable on ongoing works in ITU-T, IEC and ISO related to smart cities and communities;

- To maximize efforts in order to identify new areas of cooperation related to smart cities and communities;
- To develop a holistic view on smart cities and communities taking into consideration the scope, areas of work and expertise of ITU-T, IEC and ISO to support smart cities and communities' development;
- To prioritize future items that may arise from future World Smart City Forum (WSCF)
- ITU-T, ISO and IEC should designate the experts to work on the action items identified as priority by the Task Force;
- To oversee the implementation of these action items;
- To share the ongoing development of the work items produced by the three organizations to minimize duplication

Participants:

- Each organization will appoint 1 lead (one person)
- Further experts may be nominated by each corresponding organization

Secretariat:

- IEC-ISO-ITU-T

Life time of Joint-Smart Cities Task force (J-SCTF):

- 2 years (possibly extended if endorsed by SMB, TMB and TSAG)

Requests the IEC-ISO-ITU-T smart cities task force to provide a short progress report on a yearly basis to SMB, TMB and TSAG through the respective Secretaries
