I am pleased to invite you to participate in the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) Regional Development Forum (RDF) for the Africa region, which will take place at the King Fahd Palace, Dakar, Senegal, organized in collaboration with the Ministry of Posts and Telecommunications of Senegal and the Africa Telecommunications Union (ATU). The Forum will be held on 9-10 September 2015, back-to-back with the World Telecommunication Standardization Assembly (WTSA) Preparatory Meeting, to be held in the same venue on 7-8 September 2015. The Regional Development Forum for Africa will discuss in detail the five regional initiatives approved by WTDC-14, providing members with an opportunity to exchange experiences and best practices in their implementation within the scope of the ITU Strategic Plan for 2016-2019.

(governments, administrators and regulators) and over 700 Sector Members from the information and communication technology (ICT) sector.
