Information note for participants

Registration, visa support and fellowship requests

Registration for TDAG will be carried out exclusively **online through focal points** designated by each administration and entity entitled to participate in the TDAG meeting. Online registration will open on **Tuesday, 9 January 2018** at <u>http://www.itu.int/net3/ITU-D/meetings/registration/</u>.

On-site registration and badging for the TDAG meeting will open on 9 April 2018 at 0730 hours at the ITU Montbrillant Building.

Registered delegates will only need to bring their "Confirmation of Registration" letter from ITU and a photo ID. Delegates who did not register online will also be requested to provide a letter of accreditation from the designated focal point (DFP) of their entity to register on site.

When needed, visa support must also be requested by the designated focal point during the on-line registration process. Please note that a strict procedure for visas is in force in Switzerland and participants are urged to read carefully the visa procedure available on the TDAG website: http://www.itu.int/en/ITU-D/Conferences/TDAG/Pages/default.aspx . Please note that the processing of a request for a Schengen visa takes a minimum of three weeks.

The role of a designated focal point is to handle registration formalities for his/her respective administration/entity. The list of designated focal points can be accessed using a TIES log-in at http://www.itu.int/net3/ITU-D/meetings/registration/.

To modify the contact details of a focal point for registration or to change the focal point, an official fax from an authorized official should be sent to the BDT Meetings Registration Service (+41 22 730 5545/ +41 22 730 5484 or by e-mail to <u>bdtmeetingsregistration@itu.int</u>), providing the updated details: last name, first name and e-mail address.

Within the budget available, one fellowship per country may be granted to participants from countries with a GDP per capita of less than USD 2 000, with priority to least developed countries (LDCs). Because of budgetary constraints, beneficiary countries of a fellowship may have to contribute to the fellowship. To request a fellowship form, participants must first register online and tick the appropriate box.

The approved and signed fellowship form must be returned to the Fellowship Service at <u>Fellowships@itu.int</u> no later than 11 February 2018.

Forms received after the deadline will not be considered.

Interpretation and translation

Interpretation for the TDAG meeting will be provided based on the requests of participants. You are therefore invited to indicate on the registration form **before 22 February 2018** whether you require a language other than English.

The Inter-Sector Coordination Team on Issues of Mutual Interest will work in English only.

Remote participation, webcasting and captioning

Interactive remote participation will be available at the forthcoming meetings.

In parallel, the standard webcast will continue to be provided, as will captioning.

Contributions to TDAG

As per WTDC Resolution 1 (Rev. Buenos Aires, 2017), contributions should not exceed five pages and must be submitted using the online template available at TDAG website: <u>http://www.itu.int/en/ITU-D/Conferences/TDAG/Pages/default.aspx</u>.

Please attach the original "Word" version of your contribution to the online submission form to ensure that all hyperlinks, graphics and tables are correctly displayed.

In accordance with provision 13.2.2 of WTDC Resolution 1, the deadline for the submission of contributions has been set for **22 February 2018**.

Contributions to TDAG must be received not later than 45 calendar days (i.e., by 22 February 2018) in order to be translated for the meeting. Contributions that do not meet this 45-day deadline but are received at least 12 calendar days before the opening of the TDAG meeting (i.e., by 27 March 2018) shall be published but not translated.

Contributions received less than 12 calendar days before the opening of the meeting shall neither be entered on the agenda nor distributed. No contributions shall be accepted after the opening of the meeting.

Documentation

The meetings will be paperless. Delegates are invited to bring their laptops in order to download all meeting documents locally and to access the website for new documents.
