# Winning the SDG race: bridging the digital divide by 2030

In the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic, ITU has redoubled its efforts to help countries rapidly expand connectivity, to reach the 3.7 billion still offline and the millions of communities around the world where connectivity is still too poor to offer meaningful benefits to people.

The international community needs to find new ways to overcome chronic connectivity barriers, to dramatically level-up affordable access to technology and empower people with the digital skills to use it, so that everyone, everywhere, has access to life-changing, enabling, digital platforms and services.

Building on the outcomes of the <u>ITU Road to Addis Digital Development series</u>, which started in 2020 as part of the preparatory process for the World Telecommunication Development Conference (WTDC, 6-15 June 2022), in coordination with the Office of the Secretary-General's Envoy on Technology, and in line with the <u>UN Secretary-General's Roadmap for Digital Cooperation</u>, the <u>Partner2Connect Digital Coalition</u> will be launched on 20 September 2021 at the Road to Addis: Partner2Connect meeting.

The Partner2Connect Digital (P2C) Coalition is a multi-stakeholder alliance to foster meaningful connectivity and digital transformation in hardest-to-connect communities, including those in Least Developed Countries (LDCs), Landlocked Developing Countries (LLDCs) and Small Island Developing States (SIDS). The Coalition will serve as a leadership platform to mobilize new resources, partnerships, and commitments across four Focus Areas:



Connecting people everywhere



Empowering communities



Building digital ecosystems



Incentivizing investments

In addition to the discussions on the Partner2Connect Digital Coalition, the meeting will highlight the outcomes of the Road to Addis Digital Development series, as well as launch the *LDCs State of Connectivity Report*, a joint publication by ITU and UNOHRLLS (United Nations Office of the High Representative for the Least Developed Countries, Landlocked Developing Countries and Small Island Developing States).

The <u>Road to Addis: Partner2Connect meeting</u> will be held on the margins of the **76th UN General Assembly** from **8:30-11:30 a.m. EST**. Due to the evolving situation with the COVID-19 pandemic, the event will take place in a **virtual** format.
