The Tracker enables various analytical features to pinpoint the changes taking place in the ICT regulatory environment. Using both quantitative and qualitative data, the Tracker makes possible benchmarking and the identification of trends in ICT legal and regulatory frameworks. It likewise helps identify the gaps in existing regulatory frameworks, making the case for further regulatory reform towards achieving a vibrant and inclusive ICT sector. The Tracker is composed of 50 indicators for a period of 11 years, from 2007 to 2017. It is available online at: itu.int/go/tracker.
