### **Background:**

## **Objective:**

The **TECH TALKS Series** was conceptualized as an engagement dialogue platform for ITU-D Sector Membership to:

- provide ITU-D members an opportunity to present technological trends in their areas.
- share best practices and innovative approaches they have used in their work in the space of telecommunication/ICT development.
- explore partnership opportunities in existing and new ITU projects on digital connectivity.
- network with BDT staff at headquarters and in our field offices across all the regions and with respective industry and private sector members.
