Subject: ITU maritime services database - Incorporation of information concerning Maritime Mobile Service Identities (MMSI) assigned to Search and Rescue (SAR) aircraft

Reference: Resolution 353 (WRC-03)

To the Director-General

Dear Sir or Madam,

1. With Resolution 353 (WRC-03), WRC-03 instructed the Director of the BR to consider the possibility of making provision in the MARS system for the registration of MMSI used on SAR aircraft, preferably without changing either the database format or the content of the paper publications. WRC-03 also invited administrations to notify the Bureau of MMSI to SAR aircraft.
2. In accordance with the instructions from WRC-03, the Bureau considered this issue and wishes to inform Administrations that the structure of the ITU maritime services database and the associated software have been modified in order to incorporate information concerning **MMSI assigned to SAR aircraft** conducting search and rescue communications with stations in the maritime mobile service.
3. In addition, the ITU's *Maritime Mobile Access & Retrieval System (MARS)* website has been duly amended so as to permit for the search and retrieval of recorded data concerning MMSI assigned to SAR aircraft.
4. In order to allow administrations to submit the necessary information, the Bureau has developed the notification form and electronic data submission format annexed to this Circular Letter (also available at <http://www.itu.int/ITU-R/terrestrial/mars/forms/index.html>)
5. It should be noted that ITU-R Working Party 8B, during its June 2007 meeting, reviewed the matter, based on a submission from the Bureau, and agreed on the data elements that are to be

submitted by administrations in application of Resolution 353 (WRC-03), bearing in mind that this Resolution did not provide information in this respect. The notification form and electronic data submission format that are annexed to this Circular Letter take account of the comments formulated by Working Party 8B.

6. You may wish to note that, due to the current constraints of the ITU data processing systems, the information could be provided only in English, French or Spanish (if provided on paper form) or in ISO-8859-1 (Latin-1) characters set (if provided in electronic format).

7. Data concerning aids to navigation (AtoN) and their handling will be subject to further consideration. Information regarding their possible submission will be published in a separate circular letter.

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1. Electronic data Submission Format:

Format: ASCII text file
Field delimiter: Semicolon (;)
Occurrence separator: Comma (,)

In order to avoid any discrepancy in the station data, Administrations are requested to **ALWAYS** submit the full station particulars when:

- Action Code used is M (Modification), or
- Action Code used is A (Addition).

E.g. A;111269510;SUI;HE-DOH;HC;ITU Geneva;VHF, HF, MF, AIS
A;111269110;SUI;HEABC;FW;;VHF
M;111269522;SUI;;UM;;VHF, HF
A;111269520;SUI;;HC;;VHF

2. Rules

1. The order in which the fields are mentioned in the Data Elements table should **ALWAYS** be respected.
E.g. Action Code; MMSI; Notifying Administration; Registration mark/call sign; Type of Aircraft; License Holder and contact information; Maritime radio equipment
2. No field should exceed the maximum length allocated to it (refer to the Length (Max.) in the Data Elements table).
3. Field delimiter (;)
 - Each field is to be separated using the Field delimiter.
 - The field delimiter (i.e. Semi-colon (;)) should not be used in any field.
 - Field delimiters should be used even if there is no data for a given field.
E.g. A;111269110;SUI;;FW;;VHF
4. Occurrence separator (,)
 - When more than one value can be notified for a given field, each value is to be separated with the occurrence separator (i.e. Comma (,)).
E.g. A;111269110;SUI;;FW;;VHF, MF, AIS

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
