#### **ITU CAREER HIGHLIGHTS**

- Addressed many United Nations conferences at Heads of State and Government level (e.g. Second United Nations Conference for Small Island Developing States held in Mauritius in 2005, Fourth United Nations Conference for the Least developed countries held in Turkey in 2011, Third United Nations Conference for the Small Island Developing Countries held in Samoa in 2014, Second United Nations Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction held in Hyogo, Japan in 2005, United Nations World Conference on Disaster Risk Reduction which was held in Sendai, Japan in March 2015).
- 2. Organized and spoke at national, regional and international events on information and communication technologies, development, disaster management, climate change, small island developing states, landlocked developing countries, ICT indicators, capacity building, etc.
- 3. Designed and developed a project that has become a major initiative of ITU to support countries in the immediate aftermath of natural disasters. For the first time in the history of ITU, I mobilized extra-budgetary resources for the procurement of emergency telecommunications equipment. To-date, the equipment has been deployed to almost all the regions of the world and has benefitted many countries across the globe to include: Pakistan, Malawi, Uganda, Zimbabwe, Mozambique, Kenya, Cape Verde, Dominica, Suriname, Peru, Nicaragua, El Salvador, Haiti, Chile, Myanmar, Chile, China, Samoa, Micronesia, Indonesia, Pakistan, Kyrgyzstan, Myanmar, Philippines, Thailand, Japan, Nepal, China, Tonga, Vanuatu, Marshall Islands, etc. The equipment has also benefitted major United Nations Agencies to facilitate their operations e.g. WHO, UNHCR, IOM.
- 4. Launched a project for telecommunication infrastructure reconstruction for countries emerging out of war situations or natural disasters under the "Countries in Special Need" campaign of ITU and mobilized extrabudgetary funds to finance the project. Some of the countries that benefitted include Sierra Leone, Somalia, Liberia, Democratic Republic of Congo, Ethiopia, Haiti, East Timor, Guinea, and Eritrea.
- 5. Launched a project on **big data** to curb the spread of the Ebola disease initially focusing on Sierra Leone, Liberia and Guinea. The project is now being replicated to benefit more countries in Africa and across the globe and will go beyond the Ebola disease to also enhance response efforts on other epidemics.
- 6. Mobilized extra-budgetary financial and equipment resources worthy millions of dollars for a host of projects that include emergency telecommunications, countries emerging out of war situations,

- connectivity for small island developing states, internet connectivity for developing countries, etc.
- 7. Launched a **big data** project for official statistics.
- 8. Organized and held 23 Partnership Round Tables attended by Governments, Private Sector, Development Banks, Foundations and other Development Partners to promote and attract funding for telecommunication/ICT projects submitted by Least Developed Country Member States.
- 9. Established an **E-Waste Coalition** led by ITU and composed of United Nations Agencies, Private Sector and other Partners.
