In order to ensure business continuity and the ongoing work of the Union, it has been decided to hold a virtual consultation of councillors (C21\VCC-1) from 8 to 18 June 2021, in an organized manner in line with Article 3.1 of the Rules of Procedures of the Council. This virtual consultation will therefore follow the same format as the previous ones organized in 2020, as outlined in Annex 1.

The draft agenda of C21\VCC-1 is attached in <u>Annex 2</u>. The list of items proposed to be postponed for review to a future meeting are listed in <u>Annex 3</u> for ease of reference.

A draft Time Management Plan of the virtual consultation will be available on the Council website in the coming weeks and the final agenda will be confirmed at the Opening session of the virtual consultation of councillors (C21\VCC-1) on 8 June 2021.

An informal meeting will be held on 7 June 2021, followed by an information session on the New Headquarters Premises Project. Registration to C21\VCC-1 will provide access to both the informal meeting and the information session.

ANNEX 1

Proposed organization of the next consultation of councillors (C21\VCC-1)

The virtual consultation is held in an organized manner in line with Article 3.1 of the Rules of Procedures of the Council.

- 3.1 Between sessions, councillors may consult each other by correspondence:
- either informally,
- or in an organized manner, through the offices of the chairman or, if the chairman is not available, the
 Vice-Chairman of the Council, with the assistance of the Secretary-General.

Draft Agenda

To ensure business continuity, the virtual consultation will address agenda items considered as urgent.

You will find in <u>Annex 2</u> the items that the secretariat considered as urgent (Group 1) and proposes to be discussed at C21\VCC-1. <u>Annex 3</u> includes the list of items the secretariat proposes to be addressed to a future meeting (Group 2).

Time Management Plan will be available on the Council website in advance of the virtual consultation.

Chairmanship

It is proposed that the Vice-Chair of the Council, Mr Saif Bin Ghelaita, continue to lead the discussions, as he successfully did during the previous VCCs.

Participation

The virtual consultation will be open to all members of the delegations of Council Member States, Observer Member States, Observer from the State of Palestine, and the nine Sector Members which will have been nominated for Council 2021 (3 per Sector).

Deadline for input Documents from the Secretariat

Documents from the secretariat will be posted in line with Decision 5 (Rev. Dubai, 2018) and Council Dec 556 (MOD C16) – Submission of documentation to Council sessions.

Deadline for Contributions from Member States

Member States will be able to send contributions no later than 14 days before the VCC, **25 May 2021**, to contributions@itu.int. Contributions should be short (2 pages maximum).

Conduct of the discussion

- The virtual consultation will be of a strict consultative and non-decisional nature.
- In the discussion, the floor will be given in priority to Member States of the Council.
- If a consensus is not reached and any one Council Member State wants a document or conclusion deferred, it will be moved to the subsequent physical Council session in 2022.
- If during the discussion of a document on the agenda in the virtual consultation, a consensus is not reached and any one Council Member State proposes to suspend discussion or objects to the proposed conclusion on the document, it will be deferred to the subsequent physical Council session in 2022.
- Member States will still be able to take the floor to make an intervention during the discussions even if they have not sent in a contribution.

<u>Outcome</u>

- The virtual consultation will be of strict consultative nature and will not take any decisions. It will only draw proposed conclusions pending formal decisions at the subsequent physical Council session in 2022. Proposed conclusions will be compiled in a report to be submitted by the Secretary-General as an input document for consideration to the subsequent physical session of the Council in 2022.
- It is understood that no proposed conclusion will be final, and that the discussion could be reopened on the occasion of the subsequent physical session in 2022 on any conclusion.
- For proposed conclusions on items that would call for an urgent decision by the Council and that cannot wait for a physical meeting, the virtual consultation could give orientations to the Chair of the Council and the Secretary-General, on the opportunity to activate the procedure to take decisions by correspondence as per rules 3.2 of the Rules of Procedure of the Council. If need be, the usual procedure for decision by correspondence would be followed. A simple majority of Council Member States having the right to vote would apply.

Date and duration

- The virtual consultation will start on 8 June 2021, from 12:00-15:00 Geneva time.
- The actual duration will be proposed based on the replies from Member States on the agenda items but will not exceed nine days.

IT support to be provided

- Interprefy platform, captioning, and webcast.
- There will be full interpretation in 6 languages using Interprefy.
- Individual IT support by email, chat, and telephone.

Registration

Registration is mandatory to be able to participate online. Registration will open on 8 April at https://www.itu.int/en/council/2021/Pages/default.aspx.

Registered participants will receive guidelines and links to join the virtual consultation in due course.
