
Dear Mr. Secretary-General,

Since 1998, he has participated in WRC-2000, WRC-07, WRC-12, PP-14 and other conferences of ITU as a member of the Chinese delegation and was responsible for preparations for conferences, coordination of satellite and space service matters as well as development of China's contributions. In addition, he has been deeply involved in the discussions of rules, procedures and technologies at ITU-R Study Group meetings such as SG4 and SG7. He drafted a number of contributions submitted to the Radio Regulations Board on the review of the Rules of Procedure.
