#### **Deletion of ITU-T Recommendations**

- A.1 By TSB Circular 126 of 20 September 2002, it was announced that the following ITU-T Recommendations were deleted, in accordance with the procedures outlined in Resolution 1, Section 9 of the WTSA (Montreal, 2000):
  - ITU-T Recommendation C.3 (12.03.1993): Instructions for international telecommunication services
  - ITU-T Recommendation E.201 (23.08.1991): Reference recommendation for mobile services
  - ITU-T Recommendation E.510 (25.11.1988): Determination of the number of circuits in manual operation

The conditions governing the deletion of these ITU-T Recommendations were met and 30 Member States participating in the meeting of Study Group 2 (Geneva, from 7 to 16 May 2002) proposed to delete these ITU-T Recommendations. Eleven Administrations of Member States responded to the consultation on 18 September 2002, and no objection to this deletion was received.

- A.2 By TSB Circular 127 of 23 September 2002, it was announced that the following ITU-T Recommendations were deleted, in accordance with the procedures outlined in Resolution 1, Section 9, of the WTSA (Montreal, 2000):
  - ITU-T Recommendation J.1 (17.09.1999): Terms, definitions and acronyms applicable to the transmission of television and sound-programme signals and of related data signals
  - J Suppl. 4 (17.09.1999): Terminology for new services in television and sound-program transmission

The conditions governing the deletion of these ITU-T Recommendations were met and 12 Member States participating in the meeting of Study Group 9 (Geneva, from 3 to 7 June 2002) proposed to delete these ITU-T Recommendations. Ten Administrations of Member States responded to the consultation on 20 September 2002, and no objection to this deletion was received.

### Various tones used in national networks (ITU-T Recommendation E.180)

#### Note from the TSB

Reference is made to the TSB Circular 108 that the Director of TSB addressed on 19 June 2002 to all Administrations to obtain information on the various tones used in national networks.

The List on Various Tones used in National Networks, last published in April 1998 as annex to the ITU Operational Bulletin No. 665, is now being updated.

Administrations are kindly requested to verify the data for their country, by checking the List on Various Tones used in National Networks, which is available with free access on the Internet at http://www.itu.int/ITU-T/inr/codes.html. The Notification Form on change of tones used in national networks is available at http://www.itu.int/ITU-T/inr/forms/tones.html.

Even if there have been no modifications in data since 1998, Administrations are requested to complete the form, indicating only those tones most frequently used, and return it to the TSB (Fax: +41 22 730 5853 or e-mail: tsbtson@itu.int)

The deadline was fixed at 2 September 2002.

Attention is drawn to ITU-T Recommendations E.180 to E.182, which provide guidance on the technical characteristics of tones for the telephone service, and set limits for tone cadences and frequencies. The use of standard audible tones provides advantages to both customers and operators. These can be measured in the successful completion of calls by customers and easy recognition of any tones, independent of country of origin.

Replies will be essential in maintaining an accurate List for use by operators.

#### Ireland (country code +353)

Communication of 23.IX.2002:

The Office of the Director of Telecommunications Regulation (ODTR), Dublin, announces an increase to the longest dialable number format in the National Numbering Plan (NNP) for Ireland (country code +353). This arises from the introduction of a new mailbox service which will allow fixed line subscribers to access their mailboxes by inserting digits "80" in front of their respective National Destination Code (NDC) and Subscriber Number (SN).

The introduction of this new service will increase the longest number length from thirteen (13) to fourteen (14) digits for the International Dialling Format (IDF) for Ireland.

This new service is now being introduced (September 2002).

International Number Lengths (NL) in Ireland

The International Dialling Format (IDF) for Ireland is +353 + NDC + SN

• For geographic numbers, the number length (NL) of IDF varies from ten (10) to twelve (12) digits.

#### Examples:

Mallow	+353 22 XXXXX	NL=ten (10)
Dublin	+353 1 XXX XXXX	NL=eleven (11)
Limerick	+353 61 XXX XXX	NL= eleven (11)
Portlaoise	+353 502 XXXXX	NL= eleven (11)
Cork	+353 21 XXX XXXX	NL=twelve(12)

• For non-geographic numbers dialable from abroad, the number length (NL) of IDF is twelve (12) digits.

#### Examples:

Mobile	+353 8X XXX XXXX	NL=twelve (12)
Personnel	+353 70X XXX XXX	NL= twelve (12)

• For access to Mobile Mailbox Services, the number length (NL) of IDF is thirteen (13) digits. Example:

Mailbox (Mobile)	+353 8X 5 XXX XXXX	NL= thirteen (13)
------------------	--------------------	-------------------

#### Fixed Line Mailbox Services

This new service is now being introduced and will allow fixed line subscribers to access their mailboxes by prefixing their NDC + SN with digits "80", i.e. the subscriber's telephone number is embedded in the corresponding mailbox number, as is currently the case for mobile subscribers in Ireland.

For this new service, the number length (NL) of IDF will vary from twelve (12) to fourteen (14) digits.

#### Examples:

Mailbox (Mallow)	+353 80 22 XXXXX	NL= twelve (12)
Mailbox (Dublin)	+353 80 1 XXX XXXX	NL=thirteen (13)
Mailbox (Limerick)	+353 80 61 XXX XXX	NL=thirteen (13)
Mailbox (Portlaoise)	+353 80 502 XXXXX	NL=thirteen (13)
Mailbox (Cork)	+353 80 21 XXX XXXX	NL= fourteen (14)

As mentioned previously, the introduction of this new service will increase the longest number length from thirteen (13) to fourteen (14) digits for the International Dialling Format (IDF) for Ireland.
