Title: Support for virtual, non-physical meetings

Introduction

Considering the needs of a typical developing country, for example Myanmar, their teledensity might be just over 5%. They are using various vendors` telecom equipments and it is the main reason of strong standardization for a developing country like Myanmar. The vendors' standardization becomes the developing country's standardization and they have to adapt that technology as a standard technology. How can developing countries resolve this issue?
