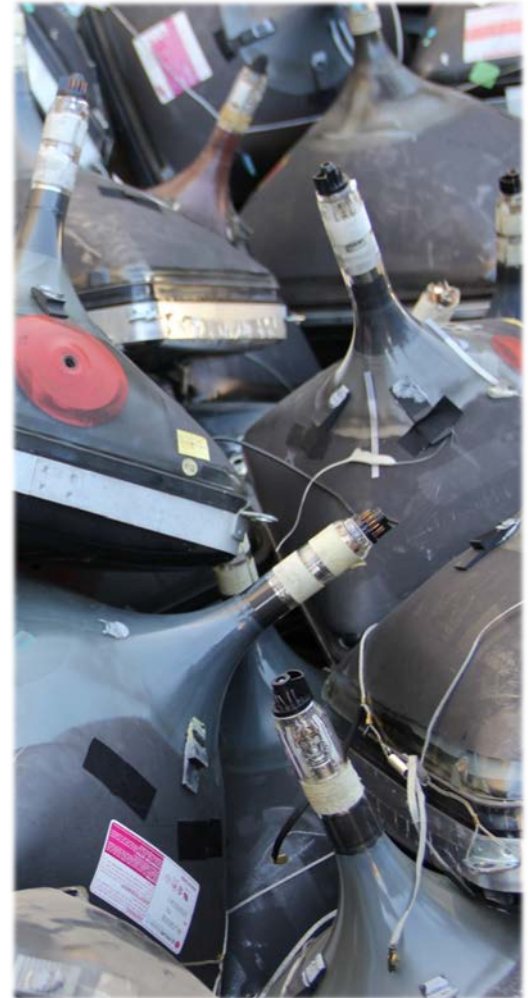

- All stakeholders have their own roles

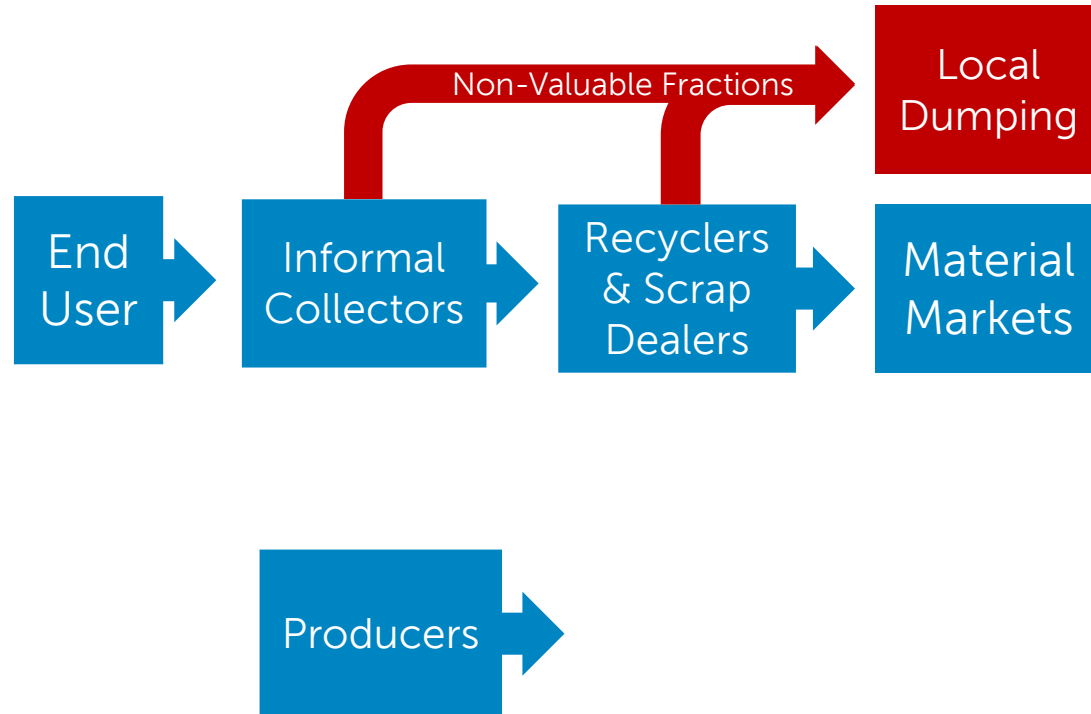

# How to make EPR work in developing countries?

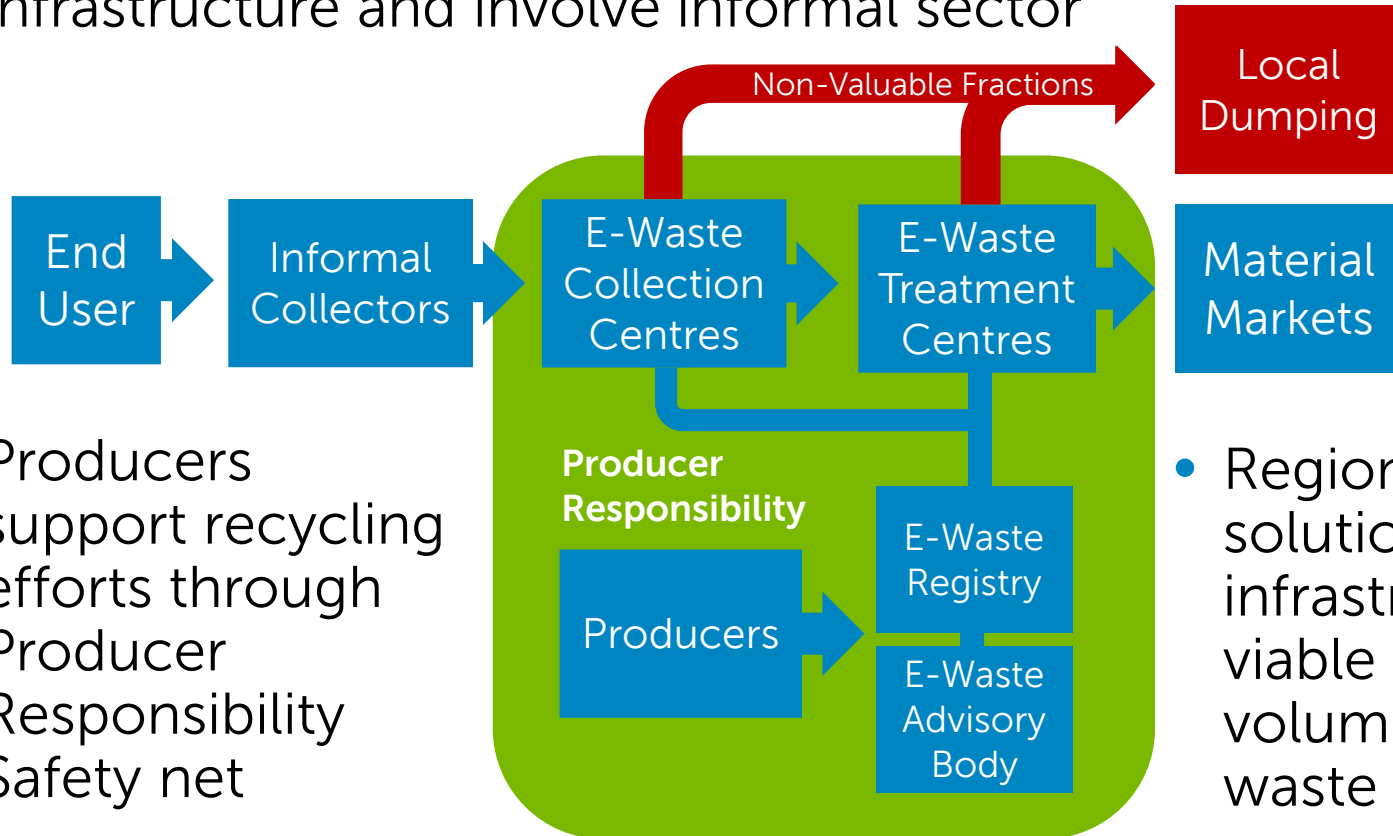
- Leverage existing infrastructure & raise the standards
