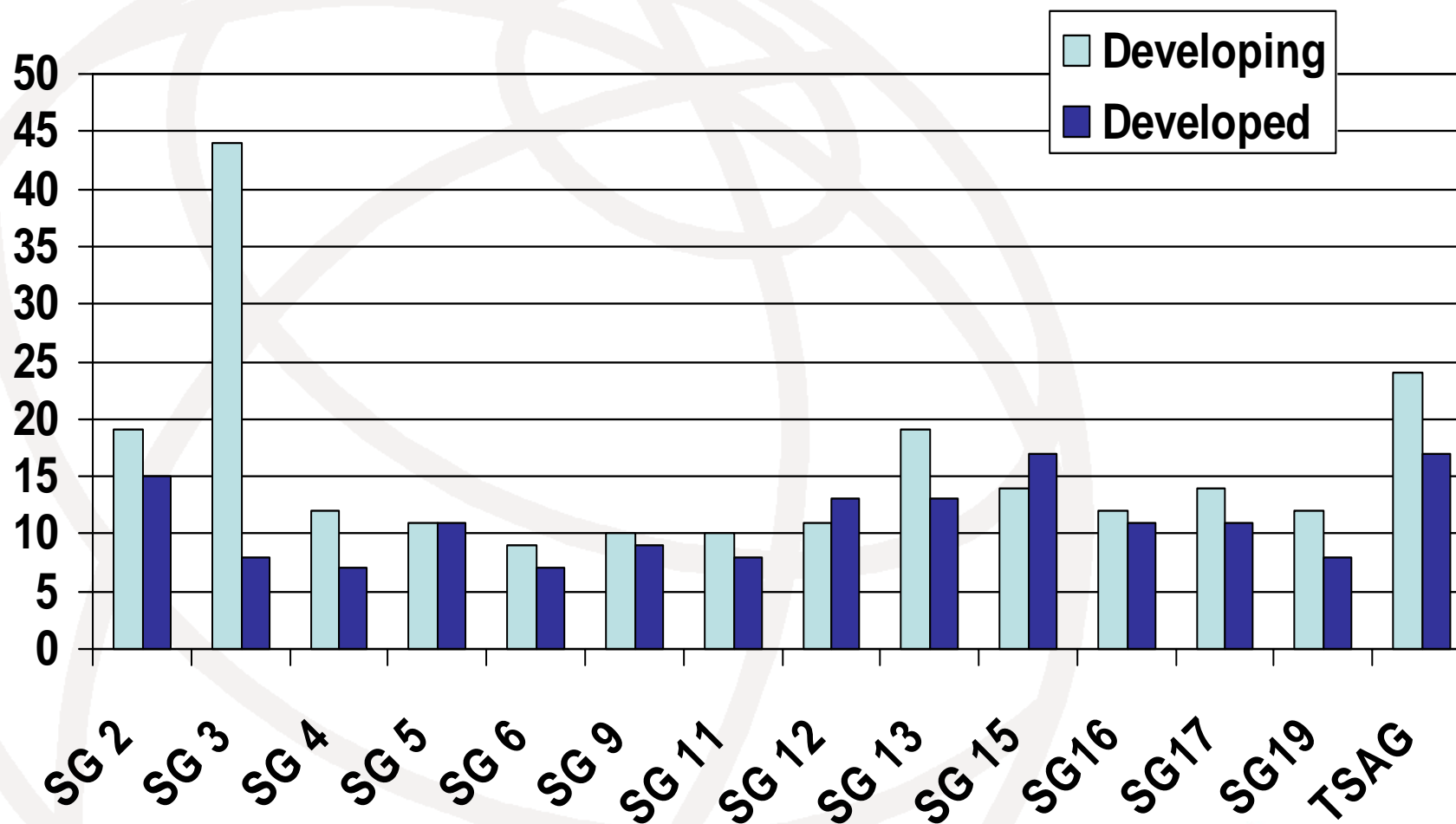

Participated number of Countries

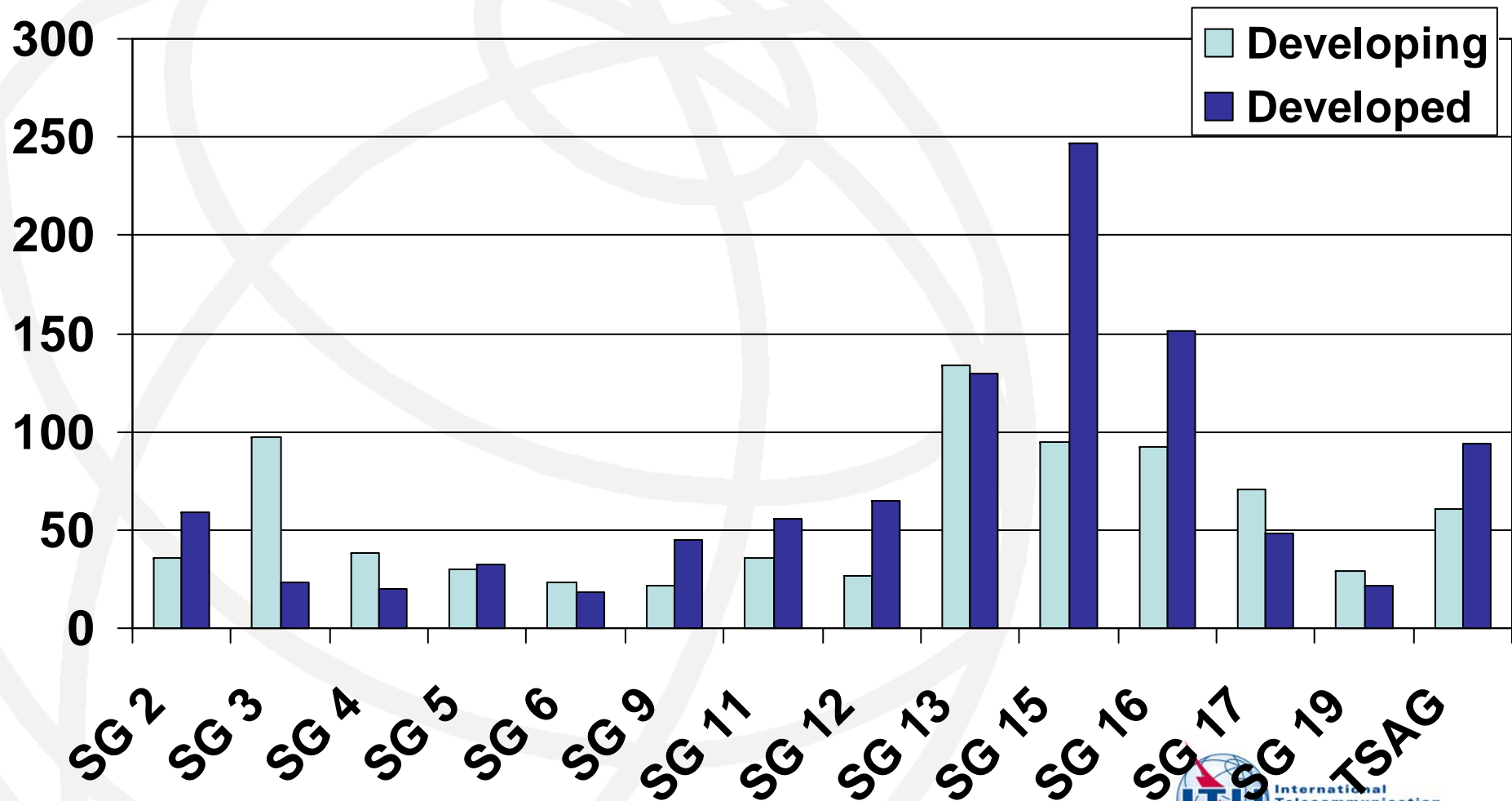

Number of Participants

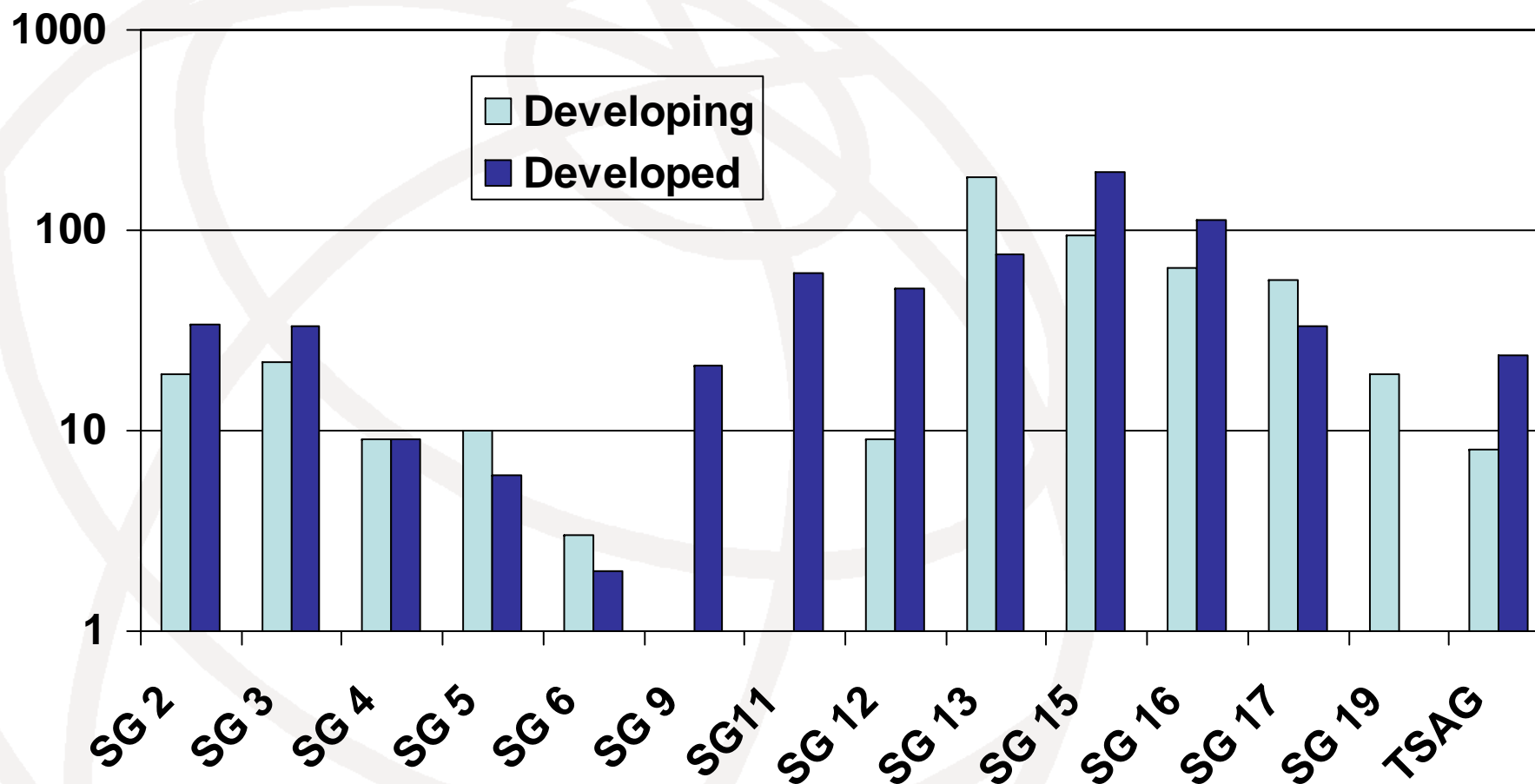

(Logarithmic scale)

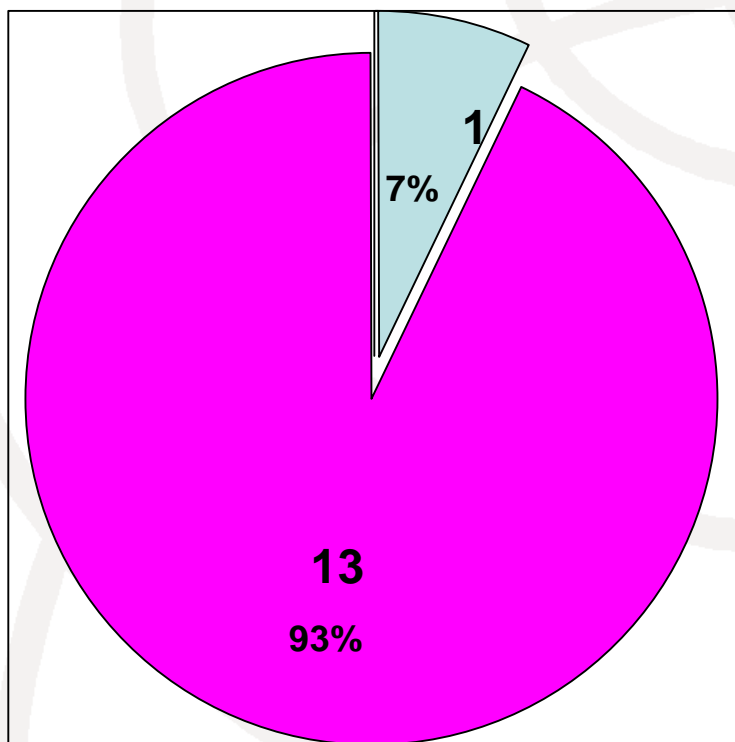

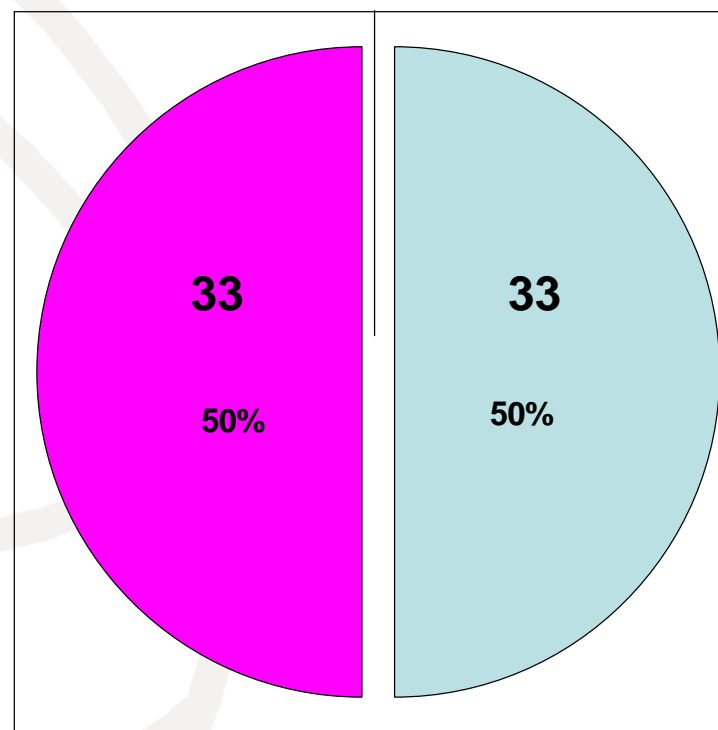

Study Group's Chairmen



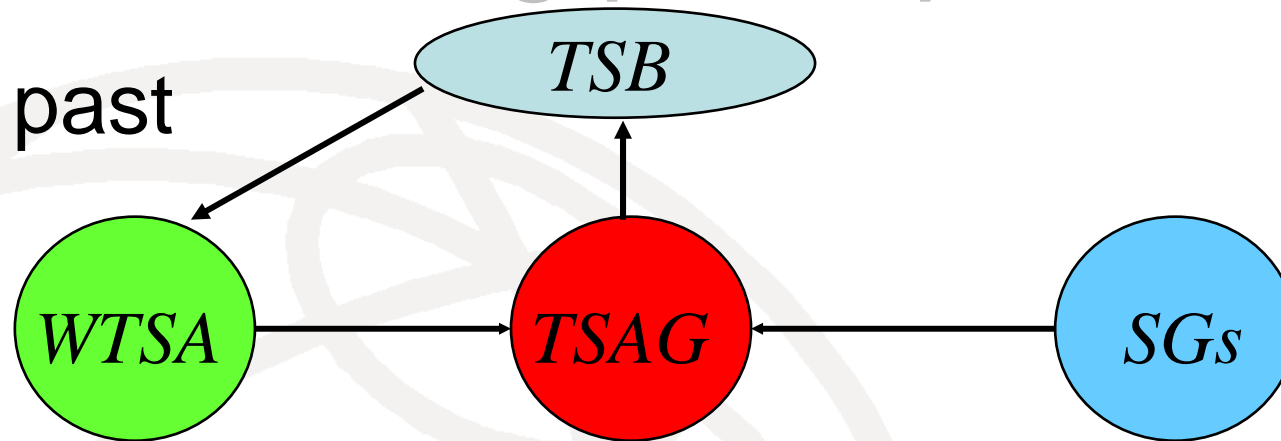
Study Group Vice Chairmen



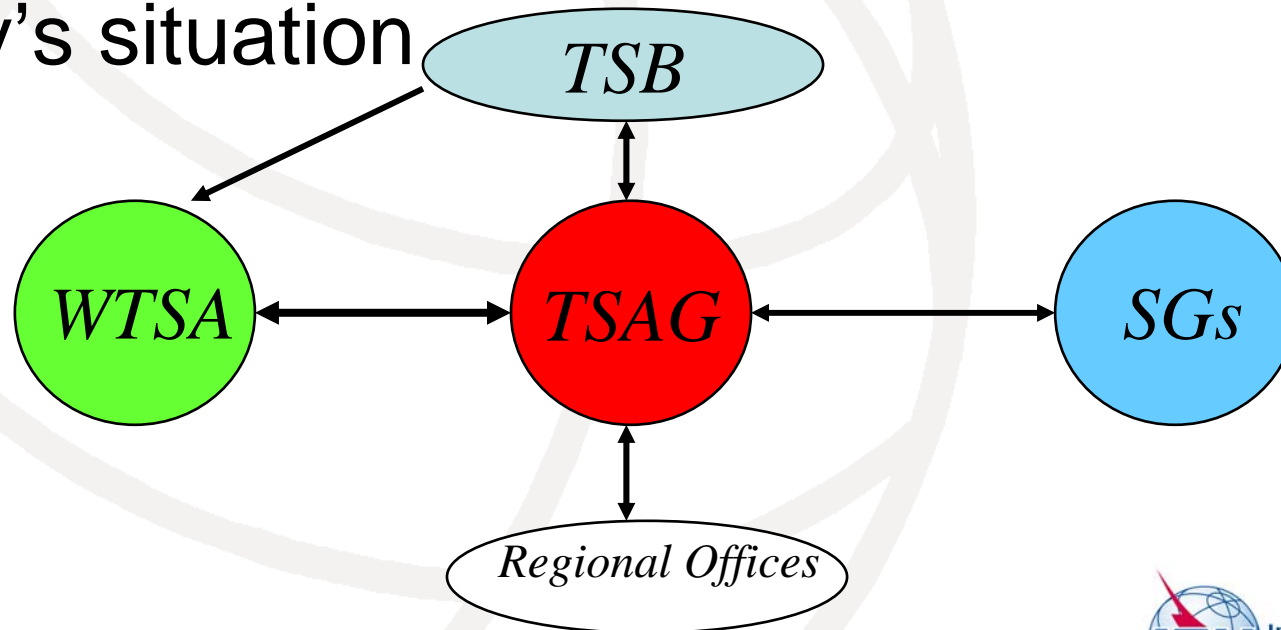

Facilitating participation (1)

- In the past

Facilitating the participation (2)

- In participating to the WTSA, developing countries had a control over SG activities
- WTSA role is changing, member states participating in TSAG have more power (PP-98, PP-02)
 - CV Art. [14](#) (Assembly may assign specific matter to TSAG)
 - CV Art. [14A](#) (enlarged mandate of TSAG)
- Necessity to participate to TSAG and to SGs
 - Direct participation
 - Through regional Groups
 - Through representatives
 - Using new technologies

Facilitating the understanding (1)

- Many actions have been taken
 - Summary of Recommendations available online
 - Free access to technical ITU-T Recommendations
 - A manual for beginners has been developed
 - Development of guides aimed at developing countries for help implementing ITU-T Recommendations
 - Seminars, Workshops, Regional meetings and Forums
 - Presentations available online
 - Audiocast recorded and available online for most events
 - Close contact and increased cooperation with ITU Regional & Areas Offices, and Centers of Excellence
 - TSB staff identified as contact point for the Region
 - Website has been improved, e-flash etc...

Facilitating the understanding (2)

- Some ideas of what could be added
 - What developing countries could do?
 - Electronic meetings after each SG? To inform the results of interest for developing countries with Questions and Answers period...
 - Regional groups, “Block meetings”
 - Remote participation
 - What else?

Reflecting regional requirements

- Develop a Question of particular interest for the region
 - On what issues your region needs Recommendations?
 - Adoption at WTSA or during SG meeting?
- Discuss the issue in the region
 - Establishment of regional Groups?
- Submit contributions
 - How to submit? Individual member or after regional consultation?
- Reply to the Questionnaires from ITU-T
 - Nominating a contact point for each SG of interest

WTSA Resolutions related to DC(1)

- Resolution 17 (Telecom. Stand. in relation to the interest of developing countries)
 - Resolves to request the Director of TSB to...
 - Instruct the Director of TSB, to provide BDT with...
 - Further instruct the study groups to take appropriate...

Where are Developing countries? What action they are taking?

Can we encourage developing countries to do something?

Example:

- To nominate a team to follow ITU activities
- To provide to them EDH to access to the ITU website etc.

Japanese common saying:

“You can’t built a house while you are sleeping”

WTSA Resolutions related to DC (2)

- Resolution 26 (Assistance to the Regional Tariff Groups)
 - This Resolutions calls upon the Director of TSB to cooperate with the Director of BDT to provide specific assistance to the RTG.
 - This was a very useful Resolution which allowed:
 - RTG to study and understand cost method
 - SG3 to approve RTG's cost methodologies
 - BDT to implement cost calculation tool (COSITU)
- Cost methodologies are being developed, this Resolution needs an update
 - TAF Group proposed changing Res. 26 to focus more on implementation of cost methodologies
 - Agreed by SG 3 (March 2008) and sent to TSAG

WTSA Resolutions related to DC (3)

- Resolution 43 (Regional preparations for WTSAAs)
 - This Resolution instruct Director of TSB to
 - Organize regional preparatory meetings
 - Support and assist the preparation of the Region
- Invites Member States
 - To participate actively
- Invites regional organizations
 - To convene interregional meetings
- Is this process working well?
Are modifications needed?

WTSA Resolutions related to DC (4)

- Resolution 44 (Bridging the standardization gap)
 - Action plan contains five programmes
 - Strengthening standards-making capabilities
 - Assisting ITU-D in enhancing application of standards
 - Human resource building
 - Flagship groups for bridging the gap
 - Fundraising
- ITU-T and TSB implemented these programmes
- What can be done to bridge the standardization development gap?
 - See other presentation on Standardization Gap.

WTSA Resolutions related to DC (5)

- Resolution 54 (creation of regional groups)
 - This Resolution invites regions to:
 - To identify the need and to establish the group
 - Instruct the Director of TSB to
 - Provide necessary support, facilitate the organization of the meeting
- Regional Groups can
 - Develop regional Recommendation
 - Exchange view on the need of the region
 - Provide the view of the region to the SG as its contribution
- What is the position of the region?
Why difficulty to create group? Need modifications to the Recommendation 54?

Other Resolutions and Decisions (1)

- [WTSA Resolution 35](#) (Chairman and Vice-Chairmanship)
 - In Florianópolis, one SG Chairman (Korea) and 33 V.C. nominated from developing countries:
 - 3 from Americas, 2 from Europe, 8 from CIS, 6 from Africa, 10 from Asia & Oceania, 4 from Arab States
- [WTSA Resolution 32](#) (Strengthening ITU-T electronic working methods)
 - TSB Director to take some actions to increase the use of EDH
 - TSB needs cooperation of Member States and Sectors Members to move to *time-t*
 - What are the impacts for developing countries?

Other Resolutions and Decisions (2)

- PP-02 Resolution 123 (Bridging the standardization gap)
 - Instruct the SG and the Directors of three bureaux
 - in pursuing initiatives that assist in bridging std. gap
 - conducting case studies on the application of Rec.
 - organizing regional standardization training course
- WSIS declaration of principles and action plan
 - ***...A well-developed information and communication network infrastructure and applications, adapted to regional, national and local conditions, easily-accessible and affordable...***

Other Resolutions and Decisions (3)

Resolution 146 (Review of the International Telecommunication Regulations)

- ITRs elaborated in 1988
 - Monopoly situation
 - Basic services only (Telegraph & Telephony)
- New Market situation
 - Competition
 - New services (Mobile, Internet)
- PP-06 Res.146 instructs ITU-T to lead review of existing ITRs
 - Work ongoing
- Options for ITRs
 - Redraft ITRs
 - Integrate into Constitution and Convention and/or ITU-T Recs.
 - Abrogate
 - No change
- Should WTSA-08 launch a PrepCom process?

Conclusion

- More and more, developing countries are leading ITU-T activities
- Tools are provided to facilitate the participation of developing countries
- WTSA-08 is a good opportunity to decide on the involvement of developing countries in ITU-T activities and to develop Resolutions for the need of developing countries
 - Take note of shift of responsibilities towards TSAG
- TSB will continue to assist Developing Countries
