WTDC 06 (Doha Action Plan)

- WTDC-06, Doha, 7-15 March 2006 (Doha Action plan)
- Comprehensive package to enabling developing countries to promote equitable and sustainable development of ICT networks and services.
- It consists of six programmes to be implemented by the ITU, (BDT), over four years.

Programmes, Activities and special initiatives

- Programme 1: Regulatory reform
- Programme 2: Information and communication infrastructure and technology development
- Programme 3: E-strategies and ICT application
- Programme 4: Economics and finance, including costs and tariffs
- Programme 5: Human Capacity building
- Programme 6: Least Developed countries and small island developing states and emergency telecommunications

Programmes, Activities and special initiatives

- Two activities (ICT statistics, indicators and information and Partnerships and promotion)
- Special initiative focusing on women, youth and children, indigenous people with and communities, people with disabilities, communities living in underserved areas, and private-sector issues.

Regional Initiatives -AFRICA

The region puts priorities on five initiatives;

Human and Institutional capacity building.

- Strengthening and harmonizing policy and regulatory frameworks for integration of African ICT markets.
- Development of a broadband infrastructure and achievement of regional interconnectivity – Connect Africa

d) Migration solutions to NGN

- i. Yearly progress report on NGN development

- ii A set of guidelines for migration from existing networks to NGN

- A general framework document of the "guidelines for developing countries on migration towards NGN" will be prepared by the next Rapporteur's Group meeting in order to stimulate contributions from developing countries.
