Council 2007, in R.1271 (MOD)

resolves

that a worldwide standardization round table and coordination meeting ("Global Standardization Symposium") be convened on 20 October 2008 at the same venue as WTSA-08



- Focus on bridging the standardization
 gap Africa has some of the highest broadband prices
 - Greater involvement of African companies and governments in standards-making
- Recommendations for action to WTSA
 - Shaping the future ITU-T work programme
- Recommendations on greater clarity in the standards development environment

LONG-TERM CHALLENGE

- More awareness and usage of free resource e.g. ITU-T Recommendations
- Increased ITU Sector and Associate Membership – increased use of international standards in ICT procurement leading to potential savings
- Influencing standards developments submission of more proposals and contributions to TSAG & WTSA
- Prioritising national capacity building emphasis on ITU- Recommendations
