Objectives and Options

- **To reduce the carbon footprint of the GTO, save money and take advantage of modern technology, all meetings of the GTO will be electronic, virtual meetings.**
 - Options to implement this decision could include some or all of the following:
 - All meetings are virtual, non-physical meetings;
 - Real-time electronic meetings can be held by e-mail, phone and collaborative software;

Initial key points for only e-meetings

- 4 countries
 - Videoconferencing is effective
 - Green option
 - Energy, time, natural resources
 - Global warming
 - Cost of travel
 - Time for travel
 - Convenient
 - Environmental issues

Initial key initial points for combination of physical and e-meetings

- 6 Countries, 1 undecided
 - eMeeting for early meetings
 - Touch and feel richness of physical meetings
 - Cultural issues
 - E-meetings for technical discussions
 - Final meetings should be physical
 - Physical meetings when there are large no. of participants
 - Optimal combination should be arrived
 - Physical meetings for final policy decisions
 - Cost of travel can be subsidized by ITU
 - ITU/other org to compensate for the carbon footprint
 - Local govt to find funds

Early Converts

- 2 countries
 - Combination of both
 - Regional meetings can be e-meetings
 - Global meetings can be physical
 - Optimal mix of physical and e-meetings
 - Training & resources
 - Industry, GTO to bear some of the cost
 - Bonding and cross cultural exchange

Conclusions

Challenge 1: Time Zone

- Starting time of the e-meetings can be at 0900 local time which moves one time zone each month, so all share the burden equally over the course of a 24-month cycle;

Challenge 2: Progress tracking

- Virtual meetings can be held over the course of several days or weeks with the group's management team summarizing e-mail contributions each day and proposing interim agreements to progress the work, and then amending their proposals based on the next day's comments;
- **Updated MoM at regular intervals**

Challenge 3: Decision Making

- How will decision-making be done with remote participation?
 - Secure Identification card for ID check
- How does the meeting know who is present?
 - Secure Identification card for ID check
- Will remote voting be required for all decisions even though currently decisions are made by consensus?
 - Yes, remote voting is required (secret ballot)
- Normally in decision-making meetings delegates have the opportunity to speak off-line with other delegates to resolve issues; however this is not possible in a virtual meeting. How does the chairman judge the mood of the room“ when they cannot see everyone?
 - Leverage advanced technologies such as Virtual worlds etc.

Challenge 3: Decision Making

- Can all remote participant views be considered before a chairman declares the decision has been made?
 - Yes
- Will the need to make a verbal statement of agreement or opposition by e-mail or phone call inhibit decision-making?
 - Yes it will inhibit
- Will the principle of “silence is agreement” that works so well in a physical meeting also work with remote participation?
 - Check with every member who is offline
