To assist and contribute to solve the problems and improve spectrum efficiency in developing countries, a regional workshop will be organized in each region on effective spectrum management which includes experts' presentations and discussions among the participants sharing knowledge on spectrum management administration and experiences in the operation of SMS4DC software. This will also be an opportunity for promoting and sharing the advantages of software assisted spectrum management tools and the know-how of effective spectrum management within the constraints of limited technical and human resource.
