The International Telecommunication Union (ITU) has been organizing the Accessible Americas series since 2014. These events have created a regional **Brand** of awareness on ICT accessibility as an enabler for digital inclusive societies that ITU aims to keep, promote and ensure its continuity in the coming years in ITU actions and initiatives in the region. The aim of these events is to raise awareness among governments in regard to the necessary measures to be taken in the area of ICT accessibility that enable persons with disabilities (PwD) to have equal opportunities and better access to information and communication technologies for a more independent life. These events also provided a networking opportunity and knowledge platform to assist ITU Members and stakeholders in the process of developing and implementing national ICT accessibility policies and facilitating promotion of national and regional partnerships in benefit of ALL.

Accessible Americas events, focuses on promoting the further development of ICT accessibility in countries and institutions, highlighting the efforts and cooperation of stakeholders to interchange resources, solutions and to share successful outcomes of projects and initiatives that contributed to make Americas region a more inclusive society. In addition, these events seek to exchange good practices on digital inclusion of persons with disabilities. Recognizing accessible ICTs as a facilitator for achieving inclusive digital societies, since 2017 Accessible Americas events also incorporated other groups with specific needs such as women and girls, youth, the elderly and indigenous people promoting the dialogue on the empowerment of all groups of persons with specific needs. These events have become a role model also for other regions. The work done so far has indeed contributed to the bridging of the digital divide, increased access to ICTs, creation of digital opportunities and ensured that a greater number of persons now benefit from the potential offered by ICTs for social and economic development.

Accessible Americas V: ICTs for ALL will provide additional key information and tools and will build capacity to enable participants to further promote the development of ICT accessibility. Awareness will be raised and promotion will be provided for projects, activities and initiatives aimed at increasing participation of persons with specific needs in the building process of digital societies and digital economies and thus reduce social inequalities. The event will also share the difficulties faced to access information, communication and knowledge by these groups with specific needs while focusing on identification of solutions. The importance of mapping, improving and implementing policies and practices on the use of accessible and affordable ICTs will be also highlighted inviting all stakeholders to increase efforts to ensure that the Americas region becomes inclusive for ALL.

The Accessible Americas V will also contribute to the World Telecommunication Conference-17 requirements and ITU Members' **Buenos Aires Declaration**¹, to reduce the digital divide, inequalities in ICT access, use and skills as well as in the availability of accessible and affordable telecommunications/ICTs, in particular for the empowerment of women and girls, persons with disabilities and other persons with specific needs.
