The Regional Development Forum is an opportunity to promote a high-level dialogue between the Telecommunication Development Bureau (BDT) and governments, regulators, ITU Member States and Sector Members.

It aims to present the BDT's work, as well as to expose new challenges and opportunities to stakeholders in order to contribute effectively to the work being conducted by the ITU in the Americas region.

As we start the ITU Development Sector (ITU-D) Operational Cycle 2018-2021, the Forum will focus on the strategic context for the ITU Members in the Americas region provided by the World Telecommunication Development Conference 2017. RDF-AMS 2018 will report on the Buenos Aires Action Plan (BaAP), with particular emphasis on the five Americas Regional Initiatives (AMS-RI) 2018-2021 that have been decided by the Members during WTDC-17

AMS 3: Deployment of broadband infrastructure, especially in rural and neglected areas, and strengthening of broadband access to services and applications

AMS 4: Accessibility and affordability for an inclusive and sustainable Americas region

AMS 5: Development of the digital economy, smart cities and communities and the Internet of Things, promoting innovation
