3. Visa requirements

In the framework of the Central American Integration System, the CA-4 countries: El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua signed on June 30 2005 the Central American Single Visa Agreement for the free mobility of foreigners between these countries. In this Agreement, three categories are established for visa exemption and compulsory purposes, according to the country of origin and nature of the travel document, namely:

1- Category "A": Visa exempt. The citizens of these countries do not need to process an entry visa to Nicaraguan territory: Argentina, Antigua and Barbuda, Germany, Andorra, Australia, Austria, Bahamas, Bahrain, Barbados, Belarus, Belgium, Belize, Brazil, Brunei, Bulgaria, Canada, Chile, Costa Rica, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Republic of Dominica, Ecuador, El

Salvador, Estonia, Fiji, Finland, France, Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, Guatemala, Greece, Hong Kong, Honduras, Hungary, Iceland, India, Iran, Republic of Ireland, Israel, Italy, Republic of Japan, Korea, Kuwait, Latvia, Libya, Liechtenstein, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Madagascar, Malaysia, Malta, Marshall Islands, Mexico, Monaco, Netherlands, Norway, New Zealand, Panama, Paraguay, Poland, Portugal, Qatar, United Kingdom except citizens British Overseas, Romania, Russia, San Marino, Schengen, Sao Tome and Principe, Saudi Arabia, Singapore, Slovak Republic, Slovenia, Solomon Islands, South Africa, Spain, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Sweden, Switzerland, Trinidad and Tobago, Turkey, Tuvalu, Ukraine, United Arab Emirates, Uruguay, United States of America, Vatican City and Vanuatu;

- 2- Category "B": Consular visa without consultation or border visa. For the citizens of these countries to enter the country they must acquire the border visa at kiosks located at Augusto C. Sandino airport or the different posts located at the borders.
- 3- Category "C": Visa consulted. Applies to citizens of these countries, who must manage their visa at least 3 months before traveling. The documents to be presented are: a photocopy of the passport with a validity of at least 6 months, original letter of visa application, original certificate of criminal or police records of the country of origin or of residence issued by the security or police entity or otherwise Interpol, original notarized document of commitment of maintenance of the applicant. Countries: Haiti, Afghanistan, Albania, Armenia, Bangladesh, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Botswana, Congo (Brazzaville), Congo (Kinshasa), Cuba, Eritrea, Iraq, Laos, Lebanon, Liberia, Mali, Mongolia, Nepal, Nigeria, Sierra Leone, Somalia, Sri Lanka, Sudan, Syria, East Timor (Democratic Republic of Timor-Leste), Venezuela, Vietnam, Republic of Yemen, Pakistan, Cameroon, Kenya.

Note:

- The visa request letter must be presented at the diplomatic representation or consulate. In Nicaragua it will be addressed to the Director General of the Dirección General de Migración y Extranjería.
- Once the visa has been approved, a guarantee deposit equivalent to the value of a return ticket to the country of origin or residence must be made.
- The notarized document of commitment of maintenance of the applicant obliges to cover the expenses of the foreigner during their stay and return to their country of origin or residence.
- The requirements for resident visas of students, professionals and others in category C are established in the common and specific requirements of the migrant categories of residents.
 - After notification of the Entry Visa to the Consular Representations, the interested party will have 6 months to make use of it, otherwise it will be without effect.
 - When there is no Nicaraguan representation abroad and for the interest of the State it is required the entry of foreigners included in Category C, the *Dirección General de Migración y Extranjería* will notify the Airline in writing the authorization to enter without consular visa, in order for the transport companies to let them board in the country of origin or residence. Once they arrive in the country, they will be authorized to enter with a border visa and will have to comply with the established requirements.

When arriving by plane, any foreigner who makes a stopover or is passing through must acquire a tourist card in the kiosks of migration. This card has a value of U \$ 10.00 and covers 90 days.

1. Vaccines:

Citizens from South America and the African continent, except citizens of the Democratic Republic of Congo, Tanzania, Sao Tome and Principe and Somalia must present an international certificate of vaccination against Yellow Fever (valid certificates issued by the Health Authority of your country of origin, with at least 10 days of validity).

6. Transportation

7. Climate

The climate in Nicaragua is tropical. Temperatures range between 33 and 34 degrees centigrade. The use of sunscreen with Factor 50 or more is recommended.

8. Currency

The currency in Nicaragua is the Córdoba. Many businesses and tourist establishments accept North American currency. The exchange rate (on Friday, May 4) is C \$ 31.30 for US \$ 1.

9. Time

The standard time in Nicaragua is six hours less than the Greenwich Mean Time (GMT-6). No seasonal adjustments are made to the time.

10. Electricity

Plugs of type A and B are used in Nicaragua.

The Masaya Volcano National Park is located southeast of Managua, at Km. 23 of the Managua to Masaya highway. It was declared a protected area in 1979 and since then it has become one of the main tourist attractions in the country, being visited by at least 120,000 tourists a year. Foreign tourists come from countries as distant as Iran, India, Ireland, Israel and Poland. However, the largest group of tourists come from the United States, Canada, the Netherlands, Spain and Germany.
