



**ITU-BDT Arab Regional Workshop on
“Competition in Telecommunications
Market”**

Khartoum-Sudan, 24-26 May 2016



Brief Description and Objectives:

The workshop will serve as a forum for competition and telecommunications policy makers, national telecommunications regulators, operators, experts and Telecom industry, to exchange information and experiences on the issue of competition policy and law in telecommunications market.

This high-level workshop will also seek to identify key issues with respect to the relationship between competition law, telecommunications regulation and telecom services providers. Issues raised might range from the institutional, such as whether competition agencies or national telecommunications regulators are best placed to deal with telecommunication competition issues, to the substantive, such as how relevant markets and significant market power are determined.

The workshop will also attempt to set of principles or “best practices” that could be used by countries that have recently introduced or are planning to introduce competition into their telecommunication markets, as well as by countries seeking to maintain or increase the level of competition in their markets.
