Tool for Creating CAP Alerts

CAP Alert Editor, Session Setup

NOTE: If an alert must be issued in less than one minute, please use your simplified warning method instead of this editor tool.


This tool is for composing alerts in CAP (X.1303) format. You must login to be authenticated in your role as authorized composer or approver of CAP alerts. (An approver is an authorized composer also authorized to publish the CAP alert.) Authentication requires your e-mail address and password.

<u>Language</u> - <u>2-letter (lowercase) ISO 639-1 code</u> for text in this CAP alert and its Internet news feed.

Status - Is the alert to be published as an actual alert or as a test or exercise?

<u>Scope</u> - Is the alert to be published as a **public** alert or published as a private or restricted alert?

MsqType - Is this a new alert, or an update or cancel of an already issued alert?





Tool for Creating CAP Alerts (selector)

Initialize this CAP alert (status: Test, scope: Restricted, msgType: Alert)

This application confirmed or created two file directories, within the designated server directory for the application, now set to null. The directory at c:/cap/en/drafts is for draft CAP alerts and c:/cap/en/alerts is for published CAP alerts.





This tool is for composing alerts in CAP format. If you are in the role 'approver-cap' you are authorized to publish CAP alerts. If your role is 'composer-cap' you can create draft CAP alerts but you cannot approve and publish a CAP alert. If you are not in either of the two roles, you cannot use the CAP Editor tool.






Composers and Approvers

- The head of the alerting authority head must designate "composers" and "approvers"
- Composers can save a draft alert
- Approvers can also publish an alert
- The username must be an e-mail address
- Each composer and approver is registered to the user group, not specific to a language


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Aggregators of CAP Alert News Feeds





Reaching People via the News Feed

- "Look for alerts here": link to the CAP news feed from agency Web site in order to leverage
 - sister agencies (e.g., civil protection authorities at national and city levels)
 - non-government organizations,
 - in-country and international news media (print, radio, television, etc.)
- Cell phone services send SMS or cell broadcast
- Amateur radio operators help disseminate alerts
- High-priority alerts automatically sent by satellite

- What is it (think in terms of "impact")?
- Where is it?
- How soon do people need to act ("urgency")?

- What actions should people take?
