Dr Jack Rowley, GSMA

Jack Rowley, Ph.D is the Senior Director for Research & Sustainability and works in the Advocacy Department of the GSMA. He is responsible for technical and policy activities related to the safety of mobile communications and responsible environmental practices. In this role, he manages relationships with major stakeholders such as the WHO and the ITU, develops technical advice for members and coordinates GSMA strategy related to EMF.

He supports the global GSMA EMF and Health working group and contributes to the work of the GSMA Europe EMF and Health group. Jack has been a member of national and international working groups and contributed to the UNEP activity that led to the first international guidelines for environmentally sound management of used and end-of-life mobile phones. He has 30-years of experience in the telecommunications industry and joined the GSMA in 2000.

Prior to that, he worked for 10 years with Telstra (Australia) primarily in the Research Laboratories, where he rose to the position of manager of radio communications research with special responsibility for EMF issues. He has also given expert evidence in planning hearings related to base station siting and made submissions to government panels. He holds an Electronics Engineering Degree with first class honours from the University of Limerick (Ireland) and a Ph.D. from the RMIT University (Australia). He is a senior member of the IEEE and a member of the Bioelectromagnetics Society.
