Baher has served on several international Internet related groups including the United Nations Commission on Science and Technology for Development (CSTD) Working Group on Enhanced Cooperation, (2013-2014); the Multistakeholder Advisory Group (MAG) of the Internet Governance Forum (IGF), (2011-2015); the United Nations CSTD Working Group on IGF Improvements, (2011-2012); the United Nations Working Group on Internet Governance (WGIG), (2004-2005). He is also a founding Board Member of the Internet Society Chapter in Egypt (2012-present).
