



2. ICT SECTOR ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE AND WORLD RANK OF MONGOLIA





10. REGIONAL INITIATIVES FOR LCDs, SIDS AND LANDLOCKED COUNTRIES

Regional Initiatives: Dubai action plan 2015-2017, ITU (To provide special assistance to LCDs, SIDS and landlocked countries in order to meet their priority ICT requirements); There are 32 countries classified as <u>landlocked developing</u>, 16 of which are located in Africa, 10 in Asia, 4 in Europe and 2 in Latin America.

- To enhancing of multi-stakeholder dialogue and increase partnerships (Ministeral Forum, conference, and strengthening of partnerships with APT, PITA, World Bank, ADB, APNIC);
- To support the improvement of national/sub-regional ICT policy & regulatory framework (unique ICT needs and challenges for LDCs, SIDS and landlocked developing countries);
- To implement special program/projects and assistance (ITU, APT, ITU-ADB, Japan, USAID);
- HRD and Capacity building;
