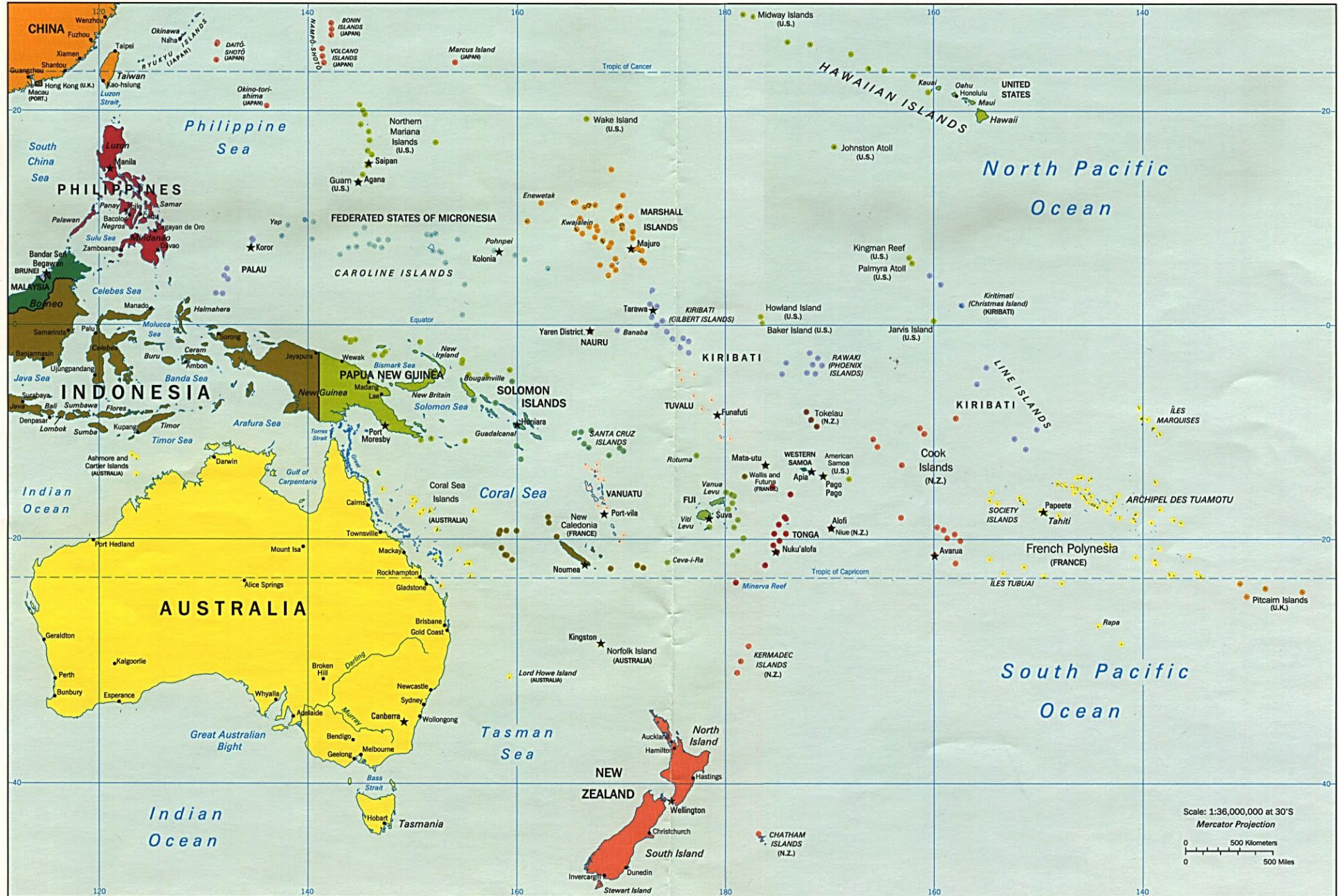

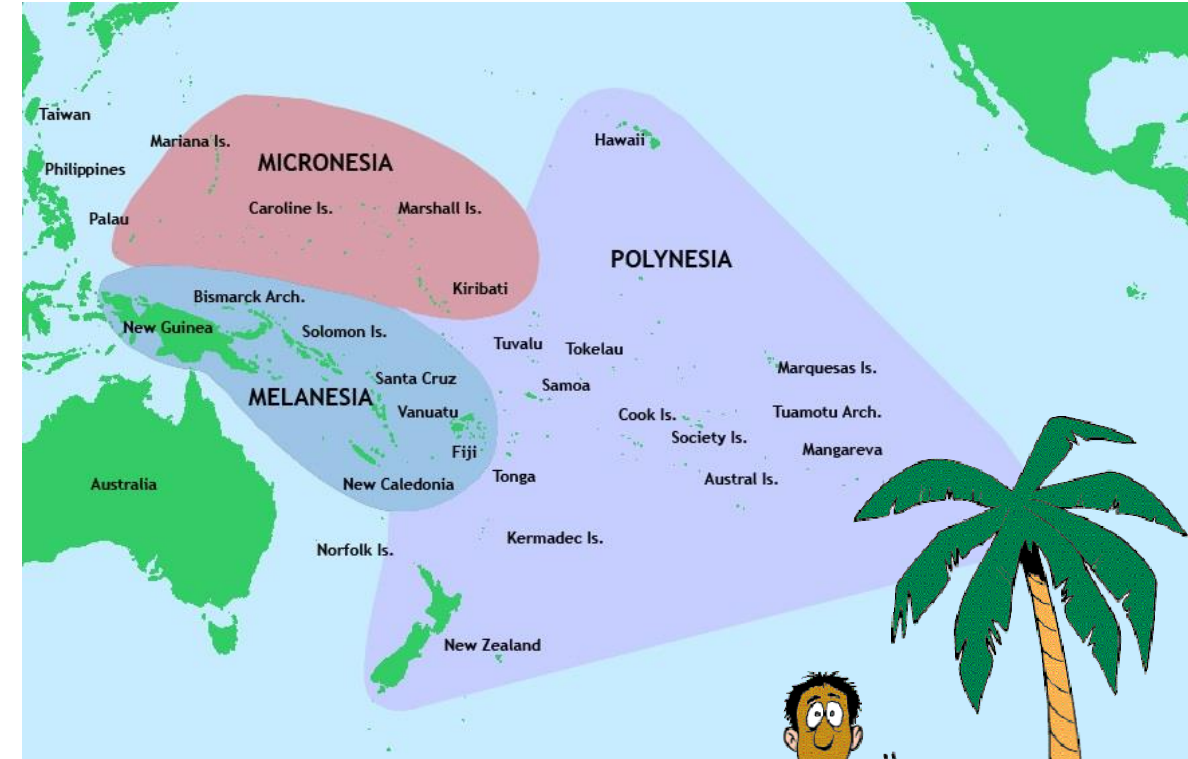
MAP OF THE PACIFIC ISLANDS

- Mostly Least Developing and Least Developed countries



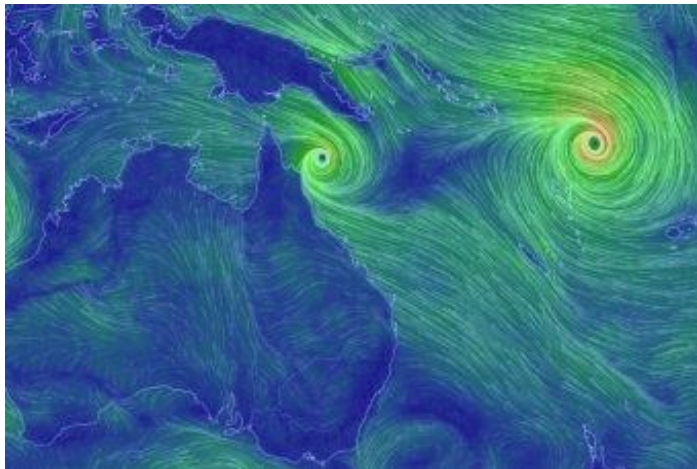
Briefly about the Pacific Islands - Threats

- Flooding

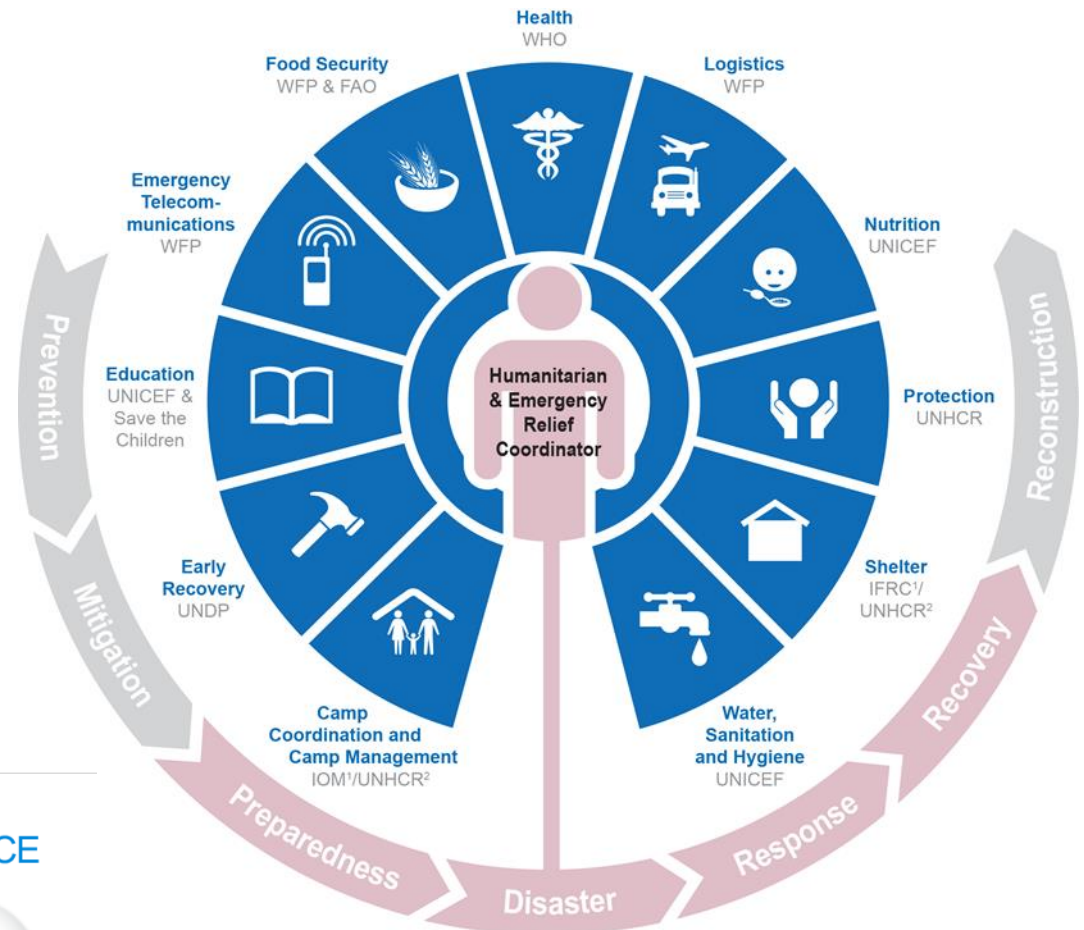
