70 % Buddhist, 15% Hindu, 8% Christian 7% Muslim,



- The National TV Broadcaster in Sri Lanka
- Officially Commenced on 15th Feb 1982
- Three Program Channels operated at present
- Over 90 % of TV Coverage (Population)
- Archived asset over 35 years of Sri Lankan history of more than 75000 Hours on analog tape formats
- Digital Test Transmission commenced in 2012 from Kokavil using DVB-T2 and ISDB-T from Colombo in 2014





Road Map for the Digital Terrestrial Television Transmission in Sri Lanka

- 2012 Commenced DTV Transmission from Kokavil for Northern Province on European DVB-T2 System
- 2014 Adopted Japanese ISDB T System and Commenced DTV test transmission in Colombo
- 2017 Planned to commence DTV transmission from? Lotus tower (350m) for western province
- 2020 Planned to complete DTV transmission Island wide ? with16 Tx stations
- 2022 Planned to Switch off Analog TV Transmission? (ASO) in Sri Lanka Island wide
