Laos PDR: Child Sexual Abuse Materials (CSAM) available at CD Shops



Indonesia : Police only recently investigated its first live streaming case



**Thailand:** Reports of an increasing use of sharing, viewing and broadcasting CSAM on apps likes line and others.



Philippines: CSAM and live streaming are a million US\$ industry


