3 issues hamper operator's broadband investment



- Long approval time
- High and multiple ROW acquisition fees
- ROW charge less transparent / inconsistent among provincial and municipal governments




- High civil work cost: 55%~70% of ODN cost
- Lack of infrastructure sharing policy to mandate the reuse of existing ducts, poles for fiber rollout
- High lease price



- Last mile monopolization by incumbent or property management agency
- Exclusive service agreement between ISP and property management agency
- Lack of construction standard and specification for fiber pre-deployment from home

Easy ROW accessibility and site acquisition





- Operators are entitled to access public ROW free of charge or by a reasonable one-time expense
- Government at all level shall simplify ROW application and streamline approval procedure to accelerate the delivery of broadband services
- Government at all level shall coordinate with investors on public and private property acquisition, ground clearance and compensation to facilitate the construction of broadband infrastructure

Mandate infrastructure sharing and joint construction





- All public infrastructures have obligation to open for fiber rollout
- Cross-ministerial collaboration to specify the common use of public infrastructure should be well functioned
- Planning construction project must be laid with optical cables or ducts to ensure the installation of broadband infrastructure
- A visible infrastructure database should be set up for collaborated construction
- Lease price of public infrastructure should be regulated to minimize broadband cost

Promote fiber pre-deployment from home







- In-building infrastructure sharing for fiber deployment should be enforced
- All new constructed and refurbished buildings, houses must be laid with optical cables and open to all operators
- Construction Code & technical standard/ specification for the deployment of inbuilding optical cables should be put in place
- The exclusive access agreement between condominium and ISP should be prohibited
- Residences that have built optical fiber can open all operators at a fee on cost basis
