Overview of ITU-D Study Groups

ITU-D study groups provide an opportunity for the membership to share experiences, present ideas, exchange views, and achieve consensus on strategies to address telecommunication/ICT priorities.

Key deliverables:

Reports, Guidelines, Best Practices and Recommendations based on inputs through contributions, case studies and surveys, which are made available to the membership through content management systems and web publication tools.

Main services:

Knowledge platform: Study Group outputs serve as guidance for the implementation of policies, strategies, projects and specific telecommunication/ICT initiatives in Member States and contribute to strengthening the shared knowledge base.

Information exchange: Sharing and exchanging information on topics of common interest and dedicated topics of interest (study Questions) through face-to-face meetings, multilingual remote participation, online collaborative sites, etc. among members with the leadership of appointed chairmen, vice-chairmen, rapporteurs and vice-rapporteurs.

ITU-D Study Groups: Key achievements to date in 2018

- Results achieved and progress made: launch of work on study Questions, appointment of rapporteurs and vice-rapporteurs, agreement on initial work plans, and draft overviews/tables of content for deliverables, including annual outputs.
- Participation in meetings and contributions received for first SG1 and SG2 meetings (30 April-11 May 2018):
 - SG1: 133 participants from 51 Member States. SG1 received 84 contributions
 - SG2: 130 participants from 50 Member States. SG2 received 93 contributions
 - 30 fellowships to LDCs and LICs granted (11 of these went to countries in ASP).
 - 52 incoming liaison statements for SG1 and SG2.
- A panel session on Early Warning Systems (EWS) was held in conjunction with the SG2 Question 5/2 meeting on 8 May 2018.
- Induction sessions for new management team members and participants on 30 April and 7 May 2018.
- Upcoming 2018 Rapporteur Group meetings:
 - SG1 Rapporteur Group meetings: 17-28 September 2018 in Geneva, Switzerland.
 - SG2 Rapporteur Group meetings: 1-12 October 2018 in Geneva, Switzerland.
- Workshops and expert meetings are being planned for 2018 and 2019.
