
The Post-2015 context (Agenda 2030 and Addis Ababa Action Agenda)

- Engaging and Incentivizing the Private Sector






Official Development Assistance (ODA) in 2019 from OECD Countries - \$152 billion




Overview of Partnerships/ Resource Mobilization Strategies

- Ensure adequate resources







Indicative timeline for receiving funding for major donors

- It usually takes a long time from identifying the partner to funding received
 - Process of engaging building strong relationships and showing added value of ITU work
 - > Intensive dialogue and involvement at national (government) and partner level
 - Negotiation of terms and conditions
 - > Examples:
 - Agreement with NORAD discussion started in Sept 2019 with agreement signing in Dec 2020
 - European Commission it takes up to 2 years to receive funding from the EC





Way Forward

Focused PRM Team support

> Monitoring and analysis of development trends

- > Outreach to Member States
- > Strengthen existing relations with current donors and looking for new prospects
- > Explore government cost sharing and private sector co-financing
- > Focused approach to CIS region to identify potential partners and donors
