










The Coronavirus (COVID-19) Response ICT Case Repository: Submission Data

Virtual WSIS TalkX



- Starting in April, at the request of WSIS Stake-holders, the WSIS Team hosted 10 virtual WSIS TalkX for WSIS Stakeholders to interact, connect and collaborate.
- The WSIS TalkX invited **37 speakers** from High-level Track Facilitators, Workshop Organizers, WSIS Prizes 2020 Champions and others highlighting their efforts to use ICTs in implementing the WSIS Action Lines and SDGs.
- 1156 participants have joined the Virtual WSIS TalkX live, whilst a big amount of audience follow the WSIS TalkX on Buzzsprout (WSIS podcast host platform), available timely after each event.
