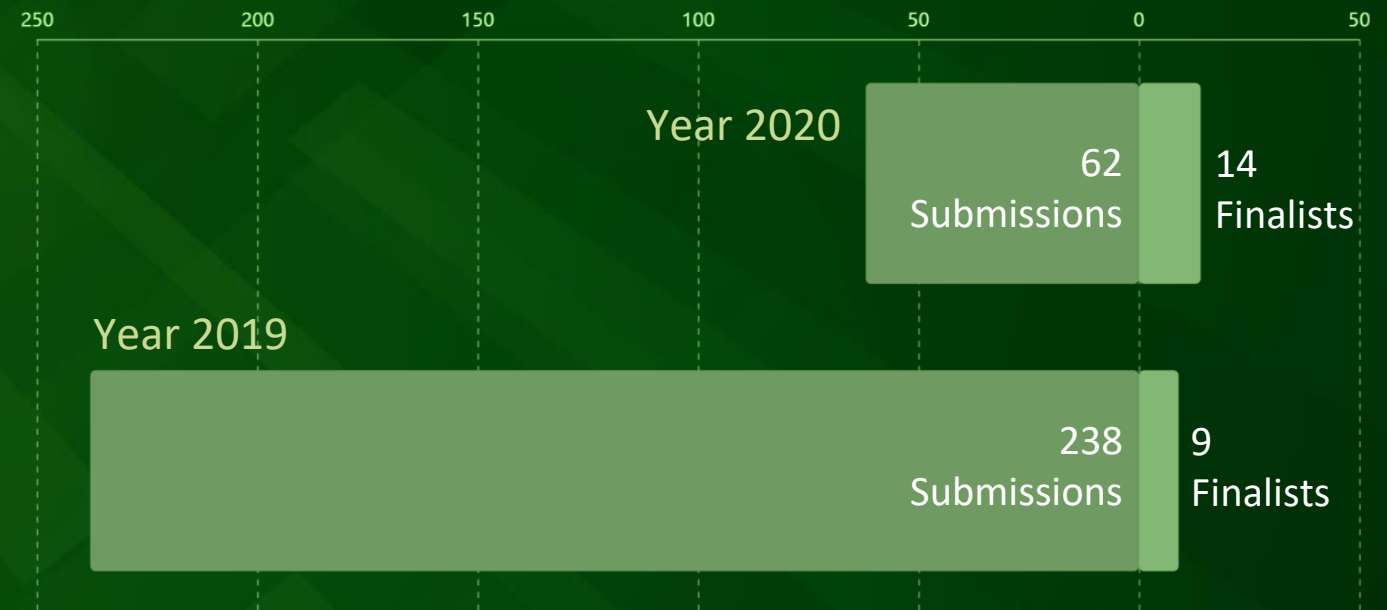
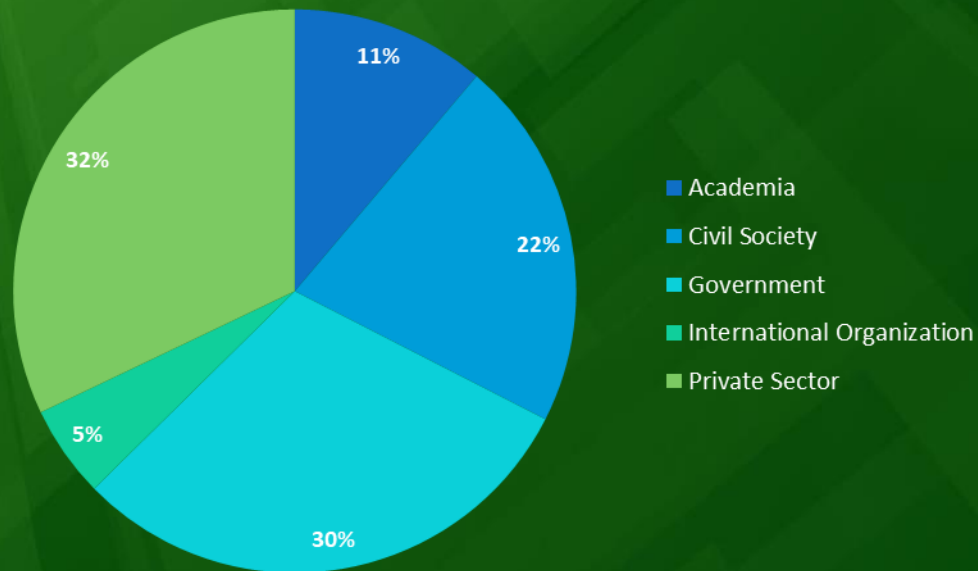

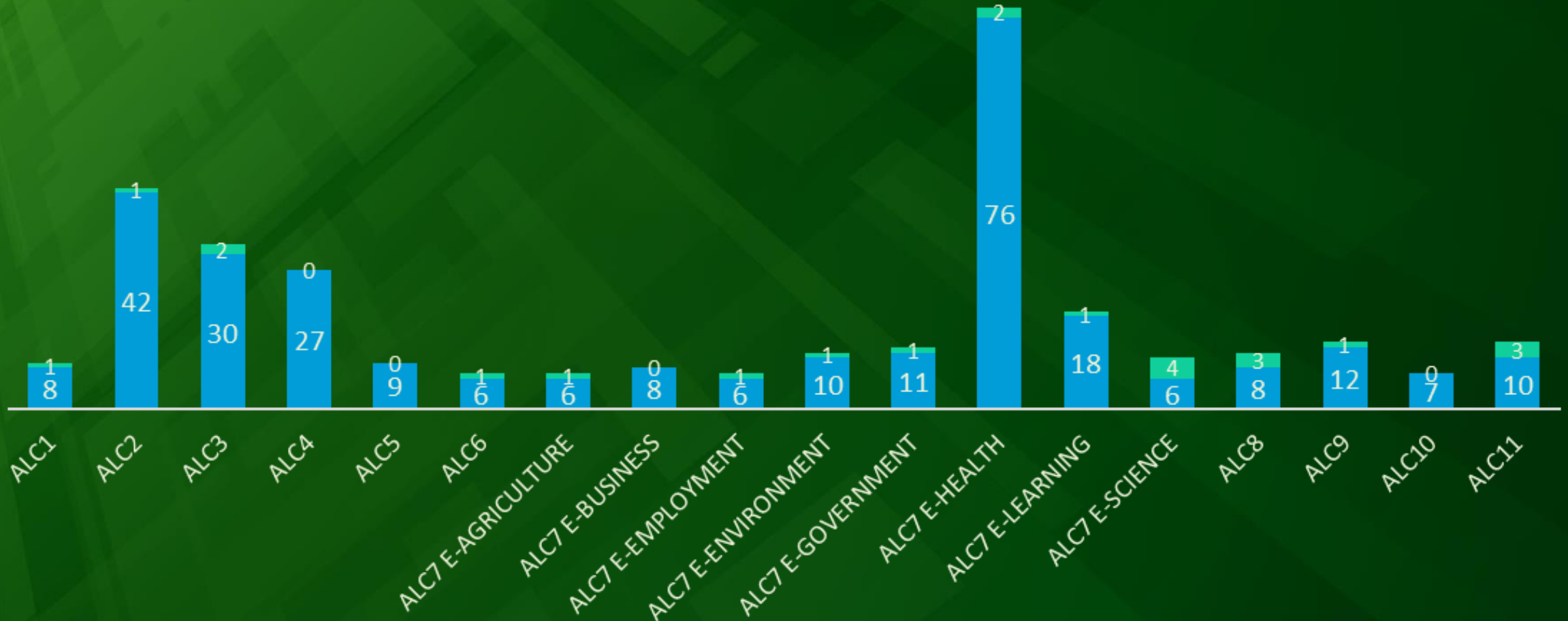

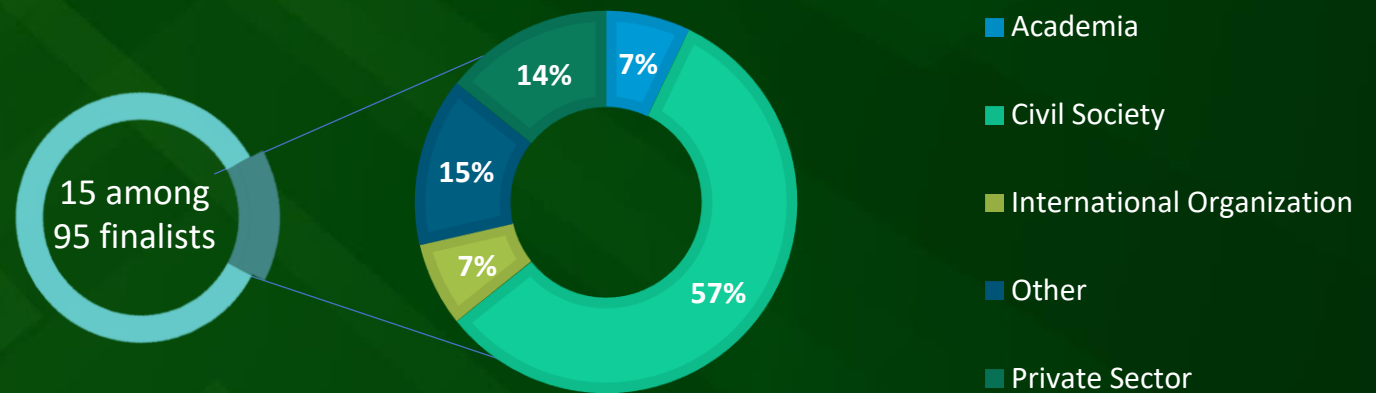


WSIS Forum Photo Contest 2020: European Submissions and Finalists

300+ photos participated so far in building a collage of ICT for Sustainable Development photographs from around the world.

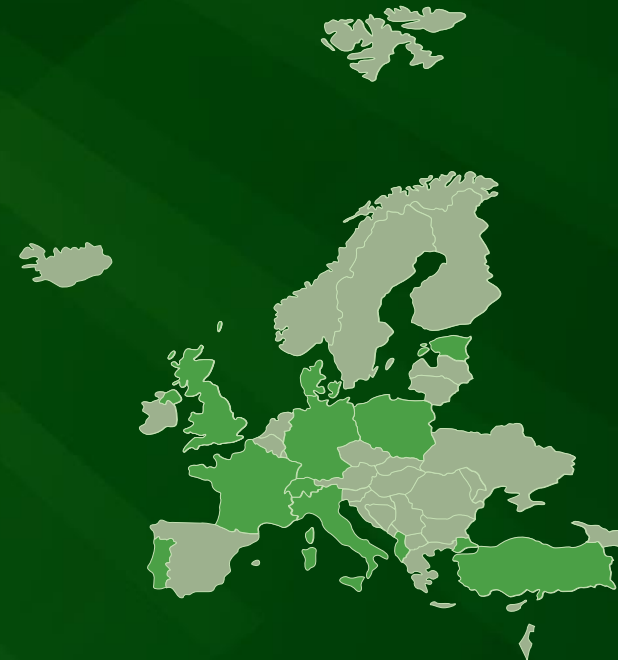

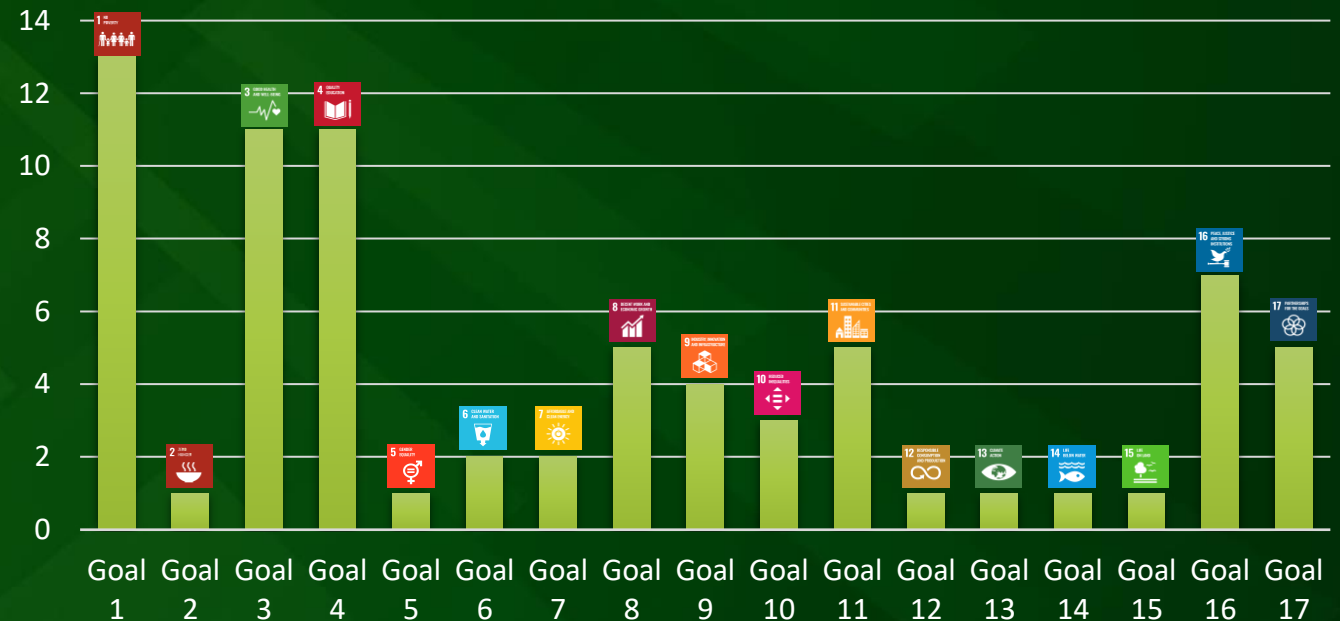

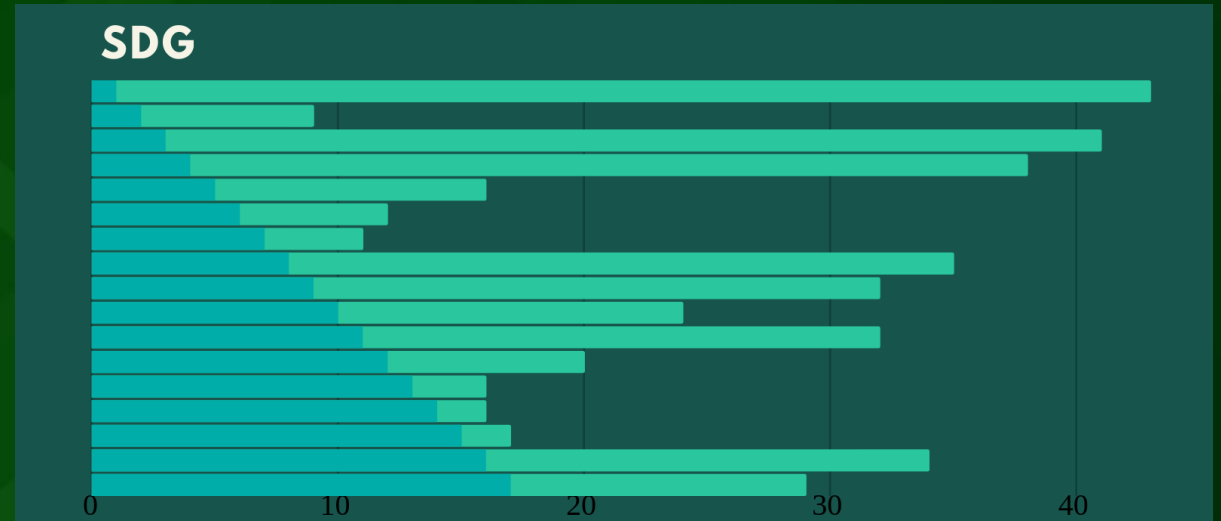

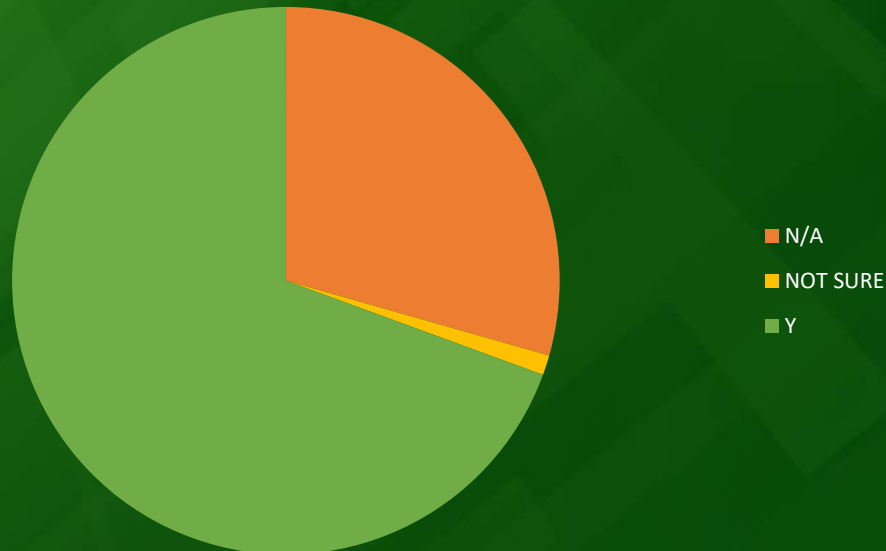


The Coronavirus (COVID-19) Response ICT Case Repository: Submission Data

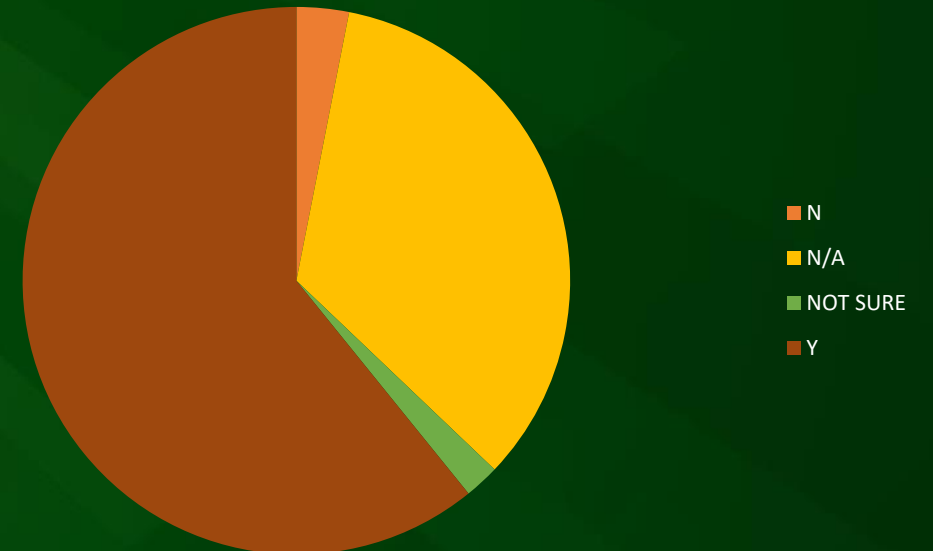

- Starting in April, at the request of WSIS Stake-holders, the WSIS Team hosted **10 virtual WSIS TalkX** for WSIS Stakeholders to interact, connect and collaborate.
- The WSIS TalkX invited **37 speakers** from High-level Track Facilitators, Workshop Organizers, WSIS Prizes 2020 Champions and others highlighting their efforts to use ICTs in implementing the WSIS Action Lines and SDGs.
