Taking into account ongoing regional integration in relation to an European digital society, there continues to be a great need for the harmonization of ICT accessibility throughout the region to leave no one behind in the digital age. In order to achieve this goal, there is a need to create a truly sustainable accessibility-oriented ICT-centric ecosystem. In Europe alone, one in five individuals, roughly 80 million people, has some form of disability. In Portugal, according to censos 2011, this means 18% of the population what represents around 2 million persons.
