Dear Sir/Madam,

It is our great pleasure to invite you to participate in the upcoming **Regional Forum for Europe “Accessible Europe: ICT 4 ALL”**, to be held on **13-14 December 2023** in **Madrid, Spain**, and encourage you to take part in a series of activities scheduled in the lead-up to this event, all designed to advance the digital accessibility agenda. **Accessible Europe 2023** is jointly organised by the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) and the European Commission (EC) and is co-organised by the AccessibleEU Resource Centre. It is supported by the Government of Spain, hosted by Fundación ONCE, and conducted as part of the Spanish Presidency of the Council of the European Union.

Accessible Europe is held within the framework of the ITU Regional Initiative for Europe [“EUR 3: Digital inclusion and skills development,”](#) defined and adopted by the World Telecommunication Development Conference (WTDC) 2022, jointly with the [Resolution WTDC 58 \(Rev. Kigali, 2022\)](#) *Telecommunication/information and communication technology accessibility for persons with disabilities and persons with specific needs.*

Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) are integral in fostering inclusive environments and strengthening accessibility. ICT accessibility requirements, standards, and universal design principles should be integrated from the conception stage in the development of ICT products, services, and applications. In celebration of the International Day of Persons with Disabilities, marked annually on December 3rd, **Accessible Europe** will leverage regional capacity on the topic of ICT and digital accessibility and enable interactive discussions to share good practices. Given the potential that new and emerging technologies hold in enhancing digital accessibility features, special focus will be accorded to the role of artificial intelligence and the metaverse.

In this context, ITU and EC are joining forces to engage a wide range of stakeholders in the region, such as Governments, Private Sector, Civil Society, Academia, and other ICT Accessibility actors. This collaboration aims to promote ICT accessibility, thereby creating fair and equal opportunities for persons with disabilities and support regional development.

The organisers of the event are planning an effective integration of stakeholders in the activities of the programme and request your participation and collaboration to further promote the following initiatives in your communities:

- **Pitching Competition - Call for Innovative Digital Solutions for an Accessible Europe:** With the aim of fostering the regional innovation ecosystem in ICT accessibility, “Pitching competition: Call for Innovative Digital Solutions for an Accessible Europe” is launched in the run-up to the Forum. Accessible Europe 2023 will feature a pitching session by eligible practitioners who will have the opportunity to showcase their innovative digital solutions that enhance the inclusion of persons with disabilities. Attendees will be invited to participate in a public vote to recognise the most impactful solutions presented.

- **Call for Contributions:** In an effort to advance the digital accessibility agenda throughout Europe, the Forum offers stakeholders an opportunity to deepen their commitment to digital accessibility through a call for written contributions. Facilitated through the [Partner2Connect Digital Coalition](#) and building upon its success, this call offers involved stakeholders an avenue to articulate their commitments, priorities or initiatives, either by reinforcing pledges previously made or by establishing new pledges tailored to address specific country or regional needs within Europe. Overall, it will provide an ecosystem mapping of involved stakeholders to support collaborative efforts.
