





Asia-Pacific Telecommunity (APT)

- Established in 1979 by an International treaty through the joint initiatives of ESCAP and ITU;
- An intergovernmental organization specialized in the ICT field in Asia Pacific Region
 - ICT development initiatives through various forums, technical meetings, capacity building programme, etc.;
 - Coordinating regional views toward international conferences
- 38 Members and 4 Associate Members (States/Territories in the region);
- 141 Affiliate Members (as of July. 2024) (Open to any Enterprise, Agency, Institute, Organization, Academia, etc. active in ICT/Telecommunication area in the region)



APT's Preparation for the World Radio Communication Conference (WRC)

- The APT Conference Preparatory Group for WRCs (APG);
- Established in 1996 with the objective of harmonizing views and developing common proposals from the Asia-Pacific region at WRCs;
- The main objective of APG is to organize coordinated regional activities for WRCs and RAs in order to ensure that the interests of APT Members on Radiocommunication issues are properly represented;
- The activities include but not limited to:
 - develop APT Common Proposals (herein after referred to as "ACPs") for WRCs and on matters related to ITU Radiocommunication Assemblies (RAs)
 - develop APT contributions to ITU-R Conference Preparatory Meetings (CPMs)
 - assist APT Member countries, especially developing countries, in their preparations for WRCs, RAs and CPMs

The APG (Terms of Reference)

- To identify, study and review issues associated with each WRC agenda item
- To develop preliminary views
- To review the draft CPM Report and to APT contributions, if any, to CPM
- To develop Preliminary APT Common Proposals on WRC Agenda Items
- To coordinate activities at the CPM and WRC

WRC Activities



- To identify and review issues associated with RA activities
- To review contributions to RA and to develop preliminary views on these issues
- To develop Preliminary APT Common Proposals to RA
- To coordinate any other issues related to RA activities

RA Activities



- To cooperate with ITU and other regional organizations
- To inform the preparation of ITU and other regional organizations to APT members
- To inform the activities of the activities of the Informal Group to APT members
- To develop contributions to any other groups on WRC Agenda Items, if necessary

The APG-27 Structure

APG27-1 established the following structure of the Working Parties (WPs) of APG-27 for the preparation of WRC-27. The structure is similar to the structure of CPM-27 Report Chapters



- Fixed-satellite and broadcasting-satellite issues
- Agenda Items: 1.1, 1.2, 1.3, 1.4, 1.5, 1.6 and 7



- Fixed, mobile and radiolocation issues
- Agenda Items: 1.7, 1.8, 1.9, 1.10



- Mobile-satellite issues
- Agenda Items: 1.11, 1.12, 1.13, 1.14



- Science issues
- Agenda Items: 1.15, 1.16, 1.17, 1.18, 1.19



- General Issues
- Agenda Items: 2, 4, 8, 9, 10



Process of developing APT Common Proposals to WRC-27

- Five APG meeting are planned for WRC-27;
- The meetings develop and update APT Preliminary Views on WRC Agenda items based on the ITU-R studies available and input contributions from Members;
- At the final APG Meeting, Preliminary APT Common Proposals (PACPs) are developed.






- All APT Members, Associate Members, Affiliate Members, international and regional organizations can attend the regular meetings of APG


